

Grand Junction Colorado

February 28th A. D. 1893

City Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present, Mayor L. M. Miller, Aldermen D. P. Steigelberger J. S. Hall W. H. Lee A. J. Mc Cune A. K. Woodsworth A. W. Anderson J. J. Sharp and B. C. Smith. D. P. Steigelberger Chairman Finance Com.

Reported that they had examined the reports of the City Treasurer, City Marshal and Police Judge for month of January and found them correct. On motion the report of the Committee was accepted and adopted. Finance committee reported that they had examined the bills of the Grand Junction Water Co. for \$3.60 and \$5.25 and one for Roland More & Co. for \$1.50 and found same correct. and on motion they were allowed and the Clerk instructed to draw warrants for the same

Finance Com. recommended that the Water Companies bill for \$1775.00 for Hydrant rental be ^{referred back to the Council without recommendation} passed for the present. On motion the recommendation of the committee was adopted. Finance Committee further reported that in reference to Henry R. Rhones Memorial to the General Assembly Relative to State Ditch No 2 the same be indefinitely postponed. On motion the recommendation was adopted. A remonstrance against City Sewerage was read, and A. K. Woodsworth Chairman of Com. on Streets and Alleys moved that the question of City Sewerage be indefinitely postponed. The motion was adopted.

An ordinance relative to City Scales and City Wager was read and adopted article by article by the following vote.

On motion The proposition of J. F. McFarlan to furnish City Scales all complete for \$78.15 was accepted, and the Clerk instructed to draw warrant for said amount in favor of Mayor L. M. Miller

On motion the setting up of the City Scales was referred to the Com. on Streets & Alleys with power to act.

Communication from Oscar Walker to sell to the City one Street-leveler for \$12.50 was referred to Com. on Streets and Alleys

The subject of Uniforms for the Firemen was discussed and on motion the Committee on Fire & Water were instructed to get estimates and report to the Council as soon as convenient

On motion the Committee on Fire & Water were instructed to purchase the essential fire apparatus known as "Chemical Bottles" for the use of the interior department of the Holloway Fire extinguishers

The "Annual Appropriation Ordinance" was presented and read by Alderman Stetzelberger, Chairman of the Finance Com. The Rules having been suspended. Alderman Lee moved that the ordinance be adopted except sec. 6 which referred to the appropriation of \$2500.00 for the purpose of paying hydrant rental. The motion and Ordinance was adopted by the following vote D. P. Stetzelberger yeas, J. G. Hall yeas W. H. Lee yeas A. J. McCune yeas A. N. Anderson yeas J. T. Sharp yeas + B. C. Smith yeas

Alderman Stetzelberger then moved that Sec. 6, or the appropriation of \$2500.00 for the payment of Hydrant rental be adopted. Motion lost by the following vote. D. P. Stetzelberger yeas J. G. Hall no W. H. Lee no A. J. McCune no A. N. Anderson no J. T. Sharp no B. C. Smith no

Finance Committee Reported and recommended the fixing of salaries for the ensuing fiscal year as follows

That the Mayors Salary be raised from \$60.00 to \$180.00 per annum
That the City Clerks Salary be reduced from \$35.00 to \$25.00 per month
That the City Marshals Salary be reduced from \$100.00 to \$70.00 per month.
Recommendation adopted and City Attorney instructed to draw an Ordinance accordingly. Alderman Lee moved that the Salary of the Aldermen be raised from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per month motion lost

The following bills were read and on motion allowed and the Clerk instructed to draw warrants for the same
