

Grand Junction Colo. Aug. 14. 1893

The City Council met at 7:30 P.M. pursuant to adjournment, present Mayor M. L. Allison, Aldermen J. S. Hall, A. J. McCune, Wm. Campbell, J. H. Cosgrove, M. J. Devoreux, and J. J. McQuillan; <sup>The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.</sup> The Water and Light Committee made a report on the Ordinance relating to a Franchise for furnishing the city with Artesian water, and oil or gas; which was referred to this Committee at the previous meeting.

The said report stated that the Ordinance had been submitted by the Committee to the City Attorney, who had made certain corrections and alterations therein, in its revised form the Committee recommended that the same be passed.

On motion the report of the Committee was accepted and the Committee discharged, M. J. Devoreux alone opposing the motion.

A motion to suspend the rules was then offered which was defeated by the <sup>following</sup> vote; Hall, McCune, Campbell and Cosgrove voting aye, and McQuillan & Devoreux voting no.

Bill of the Grand Junction Water Co. \$90<sup>00</sup> was read and referred to the Finance Committee, there being no further business the Council adjourned.
