

## Grand Junction Colorado

September 12<sup>th</sup> A. D. 1893

City Council met in regular session. Present: Mayor. W. C. Allison  
Aldermen. J. E. Hall. A. J. McCune W<sup>m</sup>. Campbell. J. H. Cosgrove. W. S.  
Wallace. M. J. Devereux and J. J. McQuillian. Minutes of City  
Council meeting held August 14<sup>th</sup> A. D. 1893 Read and approved

On motion the regular order of Business. was suspended. for the  
purpose of hearing. Citizens present on business which concerned them  
C. P. Bliss asked permission to repair a building on lots 31 & 32 in  
Block 102. On motion a special permit was granted

An ordinance relative to artesian water. oil or gas was read  
and after a lengthy discussion referred to a special committee  
consisting of Aldermen. Hall. Wallace. & McQuillian

An ordinance relative to the selling of Milk &c near Depot Platform  
was read. amended, and adopted. by a unanimous vote of the Council  
Alderman. Devereux presented petition asking for transfer of Saloon  
License to lots <sup>part</sup> 11 & 12 in Block 144, on motion the petition was  
granted, Alderman Devereux, also presented. Bond for the above  
transfer of Saloon License, The bond was referred to committee  
on License, who reported at once, that they approved the bond  
On motion the report of the committee was adopted.

A petition from the Firemen was read wherein they asked for  
the remainder of the Annual appropriation, for the benefit of Peack-day  
On motion the City Clerk was instructed to draw a warrant.  
for \$400.<sup>00</sup> in favor of C. S. Iverson, for the purpose of aiding the  
Firemen on Peack-Day

A petition was read asking  
for a reduction of Saloon License from \$1000.<sup>00</sup> per annum to  
\$600.<sup>00</sup> per annum. the petition was referred to the com. on license  
to report at once. Aldermen Hall & McCune of the license com.  
reported against any reduction. Alderman Devereux of the License  
com. reported in favor of the reduction. Alderman Campbell  
moved to adopt the majority report. Alderman Devereux moved  
as an amendment that the report lay over until the next meeting.  
The amendment was lost by the following vote. J. E. Hall No. A. J.  
McCune No W<sup>m</sup>. Campbell No. J. H. Cosgrove yes. W. S. Wallace No  
M. J. Devereux yes. J. J. McQuillian yes The original motion was  
adopted by the following vote. J. E. Hall yes. A. J. McCune yes.  
W<sup>m</sup>. Campbell yes. J. H. Cosgrove No. W. S. Wallace yes. M. J.  
Devereux No. & J. J. McQuillian No.

A petition from  
the artesian well outfit. asking for a bonus. was read, and  
on motion lain on the table. The report of the City Physician  
for month of August, was read and adopted and on motion  
the City Physician was discharged. Reports of City Treasurer  
City Wayer, City Marshal, & Police Magistrate for month  
of August were read, and referred to Finance committee  
Finance committee reported that they had examined  
the reports of the City Treasurer, City Marshal, City Wayer  
and Police Magistrate for month of July and found

them correct. That they recommended the payment of the Grand Junction Water Co. bill for \$1.50 a bill that had been O. S. by H. J. Wharston as street boom. That they recommended the payment of the Grand Junction Water Co. bill for \$21.00 for water at City Pond from May 1892 to July 1893. That the bill of the Grand Junction Water Co. for \$90.48 for Brass Hydrant, gate, valve & for use of sprinkles be not allowed, as they had not ordered it. Finance Com. further reported that the bill of the Grand Junction Water Co. for \$1775.00 for Hydrant rental, should not be paid, from the fact that the Water Company, refused to make a test under the ordinance.

On motion the report of the Finance Com. was adopted. The following bills were read and on motion allowed and the Clerk instructed to draw warrants for the same.
