On motion the proper officers were ordered to make the transfer, upon filing of bond by W. H. H. James to be approved by the City Attorney.

The opinion of the City Attorney as to the legality of the election authorizing the issue of sewer bonds in the sum of \$25,000, was then read, deciding that the election is absolutely void, and on motion ordered placed on file

The petition of W. F. White and other citizens on the question of issuing \$50,000 water works bonds was then read.

A motion was then made and seconded to lay the petition on the table, but was withdrawn, in order to have discussion on the question

Remarks were then made by Messrs Charles F. Caswell Esq and Walter S. Sullivan Esq. A. R. Wadsworth, B. F. Jay

On motion the petition was laid on the table.

On motion, it was resolved that a committee of five be appointed by the Chair and instructed by the whole Council to confer with representatives of the water works company to demand of said company the wants of the people and to ascertain what they will take for the water works system as it is

The Mayor appointed as the committee Aldermen Coogrove, Mc Cary, Delaplaine, Gannon, Pratt.
