

Grand Junction, Colorado November 13, 1894

The City Council met in regular session, Hon M. L. Allison Mayor presiding, present Aldermen Wallace, McCary, Pratt Garrison, McQuillan and Cosgrove

Minutes of the meeting of October 9th 1894 were read and on motion approved.

Petition of James W. Bucklin for the construction of a side walk read and on motion referred to Street & Alley Committee for report

Reports of City Treasurer, Weigher, Marshal, Police Magistrate for October read and referred to finance committee

Request of J. E. Price to have use of city plow referred to Street & Alley committee with power to act

Finance committee reported, no report on officers report Reported that they had examined the bill of the Grand Junction Electric & Mfg Co. and recommended its allowance for \$368⁶³

On motion report was approved and the Clerk instructed to draw a warrant for the sum of \$368⁶³ to the order of the Grand Junction Electric & Mfg Co., all present voting yea.

* Report of the Special Committee appointed Oct 9. to investigate the question of City water works, by M. L. Allison Mayor reported that they had investigated the supply to be obtained from Mesa Creek and other streams in Plateau Creek Valley, and that a system could be constructed to bring pure mountain water to the city, sufficient to supply 30,000 people at a cost of \$225,000

An ordinance authorizing the construction of water works and calling an election to vote on the issue of bonds for the construction of the same was then offered by Mr Wallace, and on motion referred to Finance Committee with instructions to report at adjourned meeting, and the attorneys who drew same are requested to furnish opinions at adjourned meeting concerning question as to interpretation of ordinance under bond decisions as to provisions by taxation of existing fund

* Bill of Campbell & McCary for \$50⁰⁰ was referred to purchasing committee and bill of Horace C. Hall for \$14⁰⁰ was referred to Street & Alley committee, both on motion

It was moved that the city printing be taken away from the Sentinel and given to the Star Times Amendment was offered to give it to the Grand Junction News.

Note being had the amendment was lost. Those Messrs Wallace and Pratt then left the Council Chamber

Note being read on the original motion, it was declared carried, Messrs Cosgrove, McQuillan, Gannon and me Cary voting yes, none voting no.
