

Grand Junction, Colo, Nov 19, 1894

City Council met pursuant to adjournment, Hon M. L. Allison, Mayor, presiding. Present Aldermen Wallace, McCary Pratt, Gannon, Devereux, McQuillan, Cosgrove

The minutes of its regular meeting of Nov. 13, were read and approved,

On motion, the regular order of business was dispensed with and council proceeded to hear the reports of committees

The Street & Alley committee reported as follows:

Petition of James W. Bucklin for sidewalk along west side of Block 51. Committee recommended that the petition be granted for a sidewalk 6 feet wide, as asked

Bill of Horace C. Hall for \$14.00, Committee recommended its allowance for \$3.50

On motion the report was adopted, and the Clerk instructed to draw a warrant to the order of Horace C. Hall for \$3.50 all present voting yea, none to the contrary

The purchasing committee reported recommending that the bill of Campbell & McCary for \$50.00 be allowed

On motion this report was adopted and the Clerk was instructed to draw a warrant to the order of Campbell & McCary for the sum of \$50.00, Wallace, McCary, Pratt Gannon Devereux, McQuillan, Cosgrove voting yea.

The license committee reported that they had examined the application for license and saloon bond of J. E. Dulmain and Payne & Kane, found them correct and recommended their acceptance

On motion this report was approved and the bonds accepted

The Finance Committee reported recommending the adoption of the ordinance entitled

An ordinance to authorize the construction, by the City of Grand Junction, of a system of water works for fire and domestic purposes for said city, to be forever owned, managed, and operated by said city, and to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the city, by the issuance of its bonds, in the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), to raise money for the construction of said water works, and to submit to all tax payers under the law of said city at a special election, the question of the authorization and construction of said water works.

The ordinance was then read.

Mr Wallace moved that the ordinance as read be adopted. Seconded

It was moved that the ordinance be amended to read that the bonds therein authorized to be issued sell at not less than par value

On the amendment, Wallace, McCary, Pratt, Gannon, Devereux McQuillan, Cosgrove voted yea, none contrary

The question being put on the ordinance as amended, Wallace, McCary, Pratt, Gannon, Devereux, McQuillan Cosgrove voted yea, and the ordinance was declared to be adopted

On motion, the Chair appointed a committee consisting of Cosgrove, McQuillan & McCary to report on the purchase

of a team for use by the city, and report at the next regular meeting

A petition of R.E. Fletcher and others for the construction of a sidewalk along the south side of Block 101 was read and referred to Street & Alley committee

An ordinance concerning the riding of bicycles was read and referred to Finance committee

On motion Council adjourned
