

Grand Junction, Colo. Jan 8, 1895

City Council met in regular session, present Hon. M. S. Allison Mayor, presiding, Aldermen Wallace, Devereux, McQuillan, Pratt, Crawford, McCary and Gannon

Minutes of meeting of December 12th 1894 were read and approved
On motion, the petition of Strickland Bros. to erect a greenhouse at cor 5th & Colorado was granted.

The sidewalk petition of S.W. Neil and Lillian P. Voorhies to construct a sidewalk along lots 17, 18 & 19 Block 54 was read and on motion referred to Street & Alley Com. with instructions to report at next meeting

Petition of Fire Department was read, and on motion referred to Fire Dept. Committee with instructions to act as to harness and wagon and to report as to sleeping accommodations at next meeting

Chas B. Stays asked for compensation as night policeman
By permission Dr E. F. Eldridge addressed the council asking that it extend an invitation to a citizens committee to participate in arrangement of details in water works matter

It was moved that the petition be laid on the table temporarily

An amendment was offered that when council adjourn, it adjourn until tomorrow evening Jan 10 at 7³⁰ P.M. and that petition of Dr Eldridge be declared a special order of business

Amendment was accepted by mover of motion and was carried

Reports of City Treasurer, Janitor, Police Magistrate for December were read and referred to Finance Committee

On motion the City Clerk was instructed to notify persons inquiring about water works matters, that they would receive necessary information in proper time

Street & Alley Committee reported that the Division Engineer of the D & R R would be here Jan 8, 1895 at 4³⁰ P.M. and on motion the Street & Alley Committee

and City Engineer were requested to meet him at that hour with reference to Street Crossing over main street to Crawford Subd.

Purchasing committee reported recommending allowance of bills for \$3500 to E. C. Elmer and 1/2 to C. P. Bliss
Mr. Devereux presented minority of committee on \$3500 bill of E. C. Elmer recommending its disallowance on the ground that the parties who ordered the work had no authority

On motion the report was adopted and the Clerk was instructed to draw warrants for the same, Wallace, McQuillan, Pratt, Crawford, McCary, Gannon voting y'es. Devereux no

C. P. McCary reported that he had purchased a team for \$150.00 from F. J. Voeburg as per instructions

On motion reported adopted

The amendment carried, Divernt, McQuellan, Crawford, Allison voting yea, Pratt, McCary, Gammon voting nay

On the original motion, Wallace, Divernt, McQuellan, Crawford, Pratt, McCary, Gammon voted yea and it was declared carried

The bond of C. B. Stays as Spl Policeman, conditioned in the sum of \$500 with J. H. Ackerman and J. E. Dullman as sureties was read and on motion approved

On motion the finance committee was instructed to formulate plan for the City Clerk to use in keeping track of water works bills

The report of the City Clerk giving canvass of votes cast at the Special election held December 28, 1894 was read and on motion ordered spread on the minutes

On motion council adjourned until January 9th 1895 at 7.30 o'clock P. M.
