

February 12<sup>th</sup> 1895 - 7.30 P.M.

Council convened pursuant to adjournment, present Aldermen Wallace, McCarry, Cosgrove, Gammon, Crawford, Pratt, Hon. M.L. Allison, Mayor presiding

Committee appointed to secure counsel in water works suit reported that they were not able to report any definite propositions from attorneys to represent the city

On motion, committee was continued, and instructed to consult attorneys, get the amount of their fees, and report at next meeting

Mr Wallace then informed the Council of the death of James W. Morris, City Attorney and offered the following resolutions

"Whereas, James W. Morris, City Attorney of Grand Junction has passed from this life, and

Whereas, it is with sincere regret that this, the Council of the City of Grand Junction feel called upon to part with his services, which have been honestly and faithfully devoted to the best interests of this city in his official capacity

Therefore, be it resolved that the Mayor is hereby requested to convey to his family, the sincere sympathy of this body in their affliction, and further be it resolved that the Council and city officials attend the funeral services in a body and the Clerk is instructed to transmit a copy of these resolutions to his widow

On motion, they were unanimously adopted.

On motion it was declared to be the sense of meeting that bills for services on engineering corps, be made out in regular form, verified, OK'd by A. J. McCune, and audited by Finance Committee

On motion adjourned until Thursday evening, July 14<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 P.M.
