

Grand Junction, Friday, 14th 1895.

Council met pursuant to adjournment, Hon Mrs Allison Mayor presiding, present Aldermen Wallace, McCary, Pratt, Gannon, McQuellin, Crawford, Cosgrove

The Special Committee on Employment of Council reported that Council could be employed to take the case through the District Court for \$500, including compromise before and after trial

On motion, it was resolved to employ attorneys to try case in District Court for a fee of \$500, which fee will include any compromise made before and after trial. Wallace, McCary, Pratt, Gannon, Crawford, Cosgrove voting yea.

On motion, Council proceeded to ballot for selection of attorneys to represent the city in the Water Works suit and the Clerk was appointed teller

Ballot being had, the vote stood

4 votes for Bucklin & Staley

2 votes for Sullivan & Wheeler

and Bucklin & Staley having received the highest number of votes were declared the selection of the Council.

On motion the Mayor was instructed to appoint a committee of three to work with Marshal to relieve distress of the poor, and that the committee have power to purchase not to exceed 10 tons of coal, Wallace, McCary, Pratt, Gannon, Crawford, Cosgrove voting yea.

The Mayor appointed Pratt, McCary, Crawford as members of the committee

On motion, Council adjourned
