Alderman Mcleary seconded the motion which carried on the following vote: ays alderman Wallace, Pratt, Mary, Gamon, MQuielan, losgrove and brawford. The question of eyphon under the railroad tracks which was previously submitted by Mr. Nall, was taken up and on motion of alderman Wallace was referred to the Committee on Streets and alleys with instructions to make further report as to the cost of the pipe, what freight rates could be obtained etc, and report at the next ression of the Council.
