

Grand Junction, Colo. September 11th 1895.

Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7.30 P.M. Alderman Geo. R. Barton presiding. An roll call the following were found to be present: Alderman Deane, Lee, McCarry, Coleman and Barton, Absent Aldermen Wharton, Pratt, Gunnison and Mayor Allison. The minutes of the meeting of September 10th were then read, corrected and approved.

A petition of S. H. Wheeler, J. W. Collins and others regarding overflow of water in North east section of the City was read, and on motion of Alderman McCarry was referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys with instructions to report.

A petition of F. J. Lee and others for a side walk as follows:— Along the North side of Block 72, extending from 6th Street to 7th Street, on Cursey Street, City of Grand Junction, was then read. The yeas and nays were then called for on the following resolution: "Whereas in the opinion of the City Council it is necessary that a sidewalk be constructed along the North side of Block 72, extending from 6th Street to 7th Street on Cursey Street City of Grand Junction, therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk such as described by Ordinance, save that it shall be four feet wide instead of twelve feet wide, be constructed along the North side of said Block under the provisions of Ordinance concerning sidewalks.

Aldermen voting were Deane ^{yea}, Lee ^{yea}, Coleman ^{yea}, Barton ^{yea}, McCarry ^{yea}. Resolution was declared carried and the Street Commissioner was ordered to have said walk immediately built.

A petition of S. W. Neil and others for a side walk along the front of Lots Numbered 17, 18 and 19 Block 54 City of Grand Junction, on motion of Alderman McCarry seconded by Alderman Lee was referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys with instructions to report.

At this time Mr Swift representing the Mechanical Tube Works of Chicago, Ill., addressed the Council regarding change in the water works specifications. On motion of Alderman McCarry, Mr Swift was referred to the Committee on Mountain Water.

The reports of the City Treasurer, City Marshal, City Engineer and Police Magistrate, for the month of August 1895 were then submitted and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Alderman Coleman Chairman of the Committee on Streets and Alleys reported that Mr Shores refused to consider the offer of the City for the right of way for the proposed opening of Main Street through the Mottley Addition. On motion of Alderman McCarry the matter was referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys and the City Attorney.

The following bills were then read, and on motion

of Alderman Deane were allowed, and the Clerk was instructed to send warrants for the same.
