

Grand Junction Club, November 12th 1895.

Council met in regular session, Mayor Allison
presiding. An roll call there were found to be
present Aldermen Lee, McCary, Coleman, Pratt, Burton
Wharton and Dean. ~~and Mayor Allison~~, Aldermen
Gannon. The minutes of the meeting of October 4th 1895
were read, corrected and approved. A petition for
a sidewalk signed by Edwin Haimmason et al was
read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys.

A petition for a sidewalk signed by Ramsey, Bucklin
et al was read and referred to the Committee on
Streets and Alleys. A petition for reducing the license
on the Park Opera house, signed by Messrs
Haskell, Adams and Steele was read and referred to
the Committee on license. A sidewalk petition
signed by West, Voorhes et al. That had been
introduced at the last regular meeting was
reread and a motion laid on the table until the
next regular meeting. The following resolution
was then introduced by Alderman Coleman and
unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That the mayor and city
clerk be and hereby are instructed to
serve upon S. G. McMullin, the former
city clerk, a written demand requiring
him to procure and return to the
records of the city clerk for cancellation,
that certain city warrant No. 2508, pur-
porting to be issued to Lee & Bunting,
for the sum of \$233.75, which said war-
rant was wrongfully and unlawfully
permitted by said S. G. McMullin to be
abstracted from said city clerk's office,
and notifying him that unless the same
be so returned, he and his bondmen
will be held to the city therefor.

Alderman Coleman then introduced the following resolution
which was unanimously adopted. "Resolved that the
City Clerk be and is hereby instructed to serve upon
both the City and County Treasurers a certified copy of
the motion adopted April 15th 1895 Comelling the said
warrant No. 2508, to said Lee and Bunting for the said
sum of \$233.75" An ordinance entitled

was then introduced and on motion of
Alderman McCary, the rules were suspended by unanimous
vote and the ordinance immediately placed on its
passage and was adopted by the following vote,
Aldermen Voting ayes, Wharton yea, Dean yea, Lee yea,
McCary yea, Coleman yea, Pratt yea, Burton yea, Mayor,
Nay. The reports of the City Marshall, City Weigher
City Treasurer and Police Magistrate for the month of
October 1895. were then read and referred to the
Committee on Finance. A Report of the Fire and
Police Committee on the petition of J. N. Dugessott
to put a shingle roof on a Outrage within the fire limits
was then read and on motion of Alderman McCary
Sec. by Alderman Coleman was adopted and the
petition granted. A motion by Alderman Burton
that J. N. Dugessott be permitted to peddle soap in the

City and month without license was unanimously adopted.
 On motion of Alderman Burton a bill of John Phillips for
 \$200 for Police services was referred to The Committee on
 Finance. The following bills were then read and on
 motion of Alderman Burton, Sec. by Alderman Lee were allowed
 and the Clerk was instructed to draw warrants for the
 same.
