Ordinance No. 52.  
An Ordinance Concerning Fowls:  
Be it ordained by the City Council of the city of Grand Junction: Section I No chickens, geese, ducks, turkeys, or other fowls shall be permitted to run, or be at large, within the limits of the city of Grand Junction, at any time. And any person being the owner of any such fowls, who shall suffer the same to run, or be at large, contrary to the provision of this section, shall be deemed the author of a nuisance, and shall on conviction, be fined in the sum of not less than two, nor more than twenty five dollars in each case.
