

Grand Junction, Colo. May 4, 1897.

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7:30 P.M. Mayor Cla presiding. The following aldermen responded to roll call: - Fallis, Hadcock, M^c Kinney, Starr, Madenworth, Wells, Meyer, & Morton.

Alderman M^c Kinney introduced the following resolution:

Whereas, the majority of the legally qualified tax payers and voters of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, as shown by the returns of the recent Municipal election held in the said City of Grand Junction, Colorado, voted in favor of Ordinance No. 55, of said city ordinances, and in favor of the purchase by said city of the Grand Junction Water Company's plant and system of water works at a price of \$35000.00 in water bonds of the said city, or, in case said purchase cannot be made at said price, then the issuance of \$35000.00 water bonds of said city with which to construct a system of waterworks to be owned by said city; Now therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, that, in pursuance of the passage of the said ordinance No. 55, of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and in pursuance of the subsequent ratification and approval of said ordinance by a majority of the legally qualified voters and tax payers of said city voting upon said ordinance at the regular annual city election of said city, held on the 6th day of April, 1897.

That a copy of these resolutions, together with the following notice be forthwith, by the City Marshal of said city served upon the Grand Junction Water Company at the office of said Company, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Notice. -

To the Grand Junction Water Company, and to the President and Board of Directors of said Company.

You are hereby notified that, in pursuance of the adoption of Ordinances No. 55 and No. 58, of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, by the City Council of said city, and, in pursuance of the approval of said ordinances by a majority of the legally qualified voters and taxpayers of said city voting upon said ordinance No. 55, at the last municipal election held in said City of

Grand Junction, Colorado, on the 6th day of April, 1897. The said City Council, will on the 15th day of May, A. D. 1897, at two o'clock A. M. of said day, at the office of the Grand Junction Water Company in said City of Grand Junction, Colorado, in compliance with said ordinance No. 55, be prepared to tender to you, and will tender to you, the said, The Grand Junction Water Company, \$35,000.00 par value water bonds of said City, in exchange for a good and sufficient deed of conveyance from you to said City of all of your waterworks plant, system and property, free and clear from all liens or incumbrances of any kind or character, together with a valid surrender and release of any and all rights, claims and demands you may have against the said City.

And you are further notified that the said City Council will, at said time and place, deliver to you the said \$35,000.00 water bonds of said City, drawing 6% per annum, in exchange for the aforesaid deeds and receipts from you to said City, and that said bonds will be properly signed, attested and approved, and will be in form as set out in ordinance No. 58 of the Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, this 4th day of May A. D. 1897.

The roll was called, on the above resolution and notice, with the following result: - Aldermen voting, Fallis - yea, Hadcock, yea; McKinney yea; Starr yea; Wadsworth, yea, Wells, yea; Sweyer, yea; Whorton, yea. Resolution was declared adopted.
