

May, 11, 1877.

The City Council met in regular session at 8.00 o'clock P.M. In the absence of Mayor Cla, Chairman Bradenworth presided. The following aldermen responded to roll call; - Fallis, Hadcock, W. Kinney, Starr, Wells, Meyer & Thornton.

Minutes of the meetings of April 24 and May 4 were read and approved.

A petition, from E. A. Haskell, in regard to the License against the Park Opera House, was received & read. On motion the license was reduced to fifty dollars (30.00) for one year, and the amount now due reduced in same proportion, per night.

The Finance Com. asked to retain the reports of officers for March, until a later meeting.

The Water Works Com. reported progress in their work. preparation of Bonds etc. - -
