

Grand Junction, Colo. June 8 1877

The City Council met in regular session at 8 o'clock P.M. President of the Council, A. R. Wadsworth presiding Alderman present; - Fallis, Hadcock, Starr, Thornton Meyer, and Wells.

The Minutes of the meeting of May 24 was read and approved.

A Petition from the Fire Co. asking that the City Teamsters salary be fixed at \$30. per month ^{was presented}. A motion that the petition be granted was lost. The roll was called as follows. Fallis, yea, Hadcock, yea, Starr, nay, Thornton, nay; Meyer, nay; Wells, nay.

On motion of Ald. Thornton the salary of the teamster was fixed at \$45. per month.

A petition from the Fire Co. asking for more horse repairs to wagon, etc. was presented and referred to the Fire & Police Committee.

The Reports of Officers for the month of May were read and referred to Finance Com.

The Finance Com. reported on the Officers reports for April, that all were correct except the Treasurers.

The Official Bond of John Hynes, as Chief Engineer of the Fire Department, in the sum of \$500, with John Hynes, James Hynes and J. E. Delmaine as sureties was read and on motion accepted.

On motion the matter of the Night Policeman at the R. R. yards, giving Bond to the City, was referred to the Fire & Police Committee.

The City Attorney was added to the Committee, to assist in ascertaining the land to be condemned as per resolution of March 20.

On motion a committee of three was appointed to confer with the Beach Day committee, on matters pertaining to Beach Day preparation. The Chair appointed Aldermen, Wells, Weyer and Starr as members of that committee.

The following resolution was on motion adopted: "Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction: That a sidewalk be constructed along the north side of Ouray St. between Sixth Street and Seventh Street fronting on lots 20 to 30 inclusive, Block 61.

And that the St. Commissioner be and is hereby ordered to forthwith serve the proper notice upon the owners or agents of said lots, requiring them to construct a sidewalk fronting upon their lot & lots within fifteen days from the date of service of such notice".

It was moved & carried, that the contract for letting the City Printing be taken up.

On motion that it be let by ballot, resulted as follows: Connelly, 4, Price & Newton, 1. Reject all 1. Mr. Connelly having received the majority of votes was declared elected to the City Printer.

On motion the matter of making the contract with the City Printer was left with the Purchasing Committee, to report at the next meeting of Council.

On motion the St. & A. Co. were instructed to investigate & ascertain the condition of the Farmers Ditch & devise some way to make it less dangerous to children.

On motion Council adjourned to meet Tuesday evening June 15. A. B. Ferry, City Clerk
