

June 10, 1897

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 8 o'clock P.M. - Chairman Hadcock presiding. On roll call the following aldermen were found to be present: - Hadcock, McKinney, Starr, Meyer, Wells and Whorton.

The minutes of June 8 were read and approved. A petition, relative to the dumping of refuse in the north western part of town, was presented and on motion the matter was left with the St. & A. Com.

The contract with the City Printer, Wm. J. Connelly, was read and discussed and on motion accepted.

On motion the City Attorney was instructed to arrange with the Rio Grande R.R. authorities and open up the Street referred to in the Resolution of March 20.

The Fire and Police Committee recommended the granting of the petition of the Fire Co. A motion prevailed to accept the report and to order the necessary supplies.

The St. and A. Committee asked for further time on the investigation of the Farmers Ditch.

On motion the City Attorney was instructed to draw up an ordinance to cover the law regarding the collection of Dog tax.

An ordinance, No. 61, entitled "An ordinance repealing Section seven of Ordinance No. 9," was presented and according to rule laid over until the next meeting.

A petition from Mason, Broecker & Co. was on motion, referred to the License Committee.

Mr. Staley presented a petition, regarding a Bicycle path on 5th Street. On motion, Bicyclists were granted the preference right, over pedestrians, on the East side of 5th Street from South St. to the State Bridge, provided that they grade & make a good bicycle path.

Mr. Bucklin addressed the Council in regard to the appropriation of \$500. recently ^{received} ~~presented~~ to the City from the State of Colorado, ^{money previously expended for surveying the State Ditch No. 2.} On motion Mr. Bucklin was requested to prepare the necessary resolutions or ordinance to obtain the money, when the funds are available and present the same at the July meeting of the Council.

Mr. W. J. Crooks petitioned the Council that the money received ^{by the City} from the sale of four head of horses, be refunded. On motion the net receipts of the sale was allowed and the Clerk was instructed to draw a warrant for \$69.20. to W. J. Crooks.

The Beach Day Committee asked the Council for an appropriation of \$500. After a discussion, Council adjourned until Tuesday June 22, at 8 o'clock P.M. N. E. Hoyt. City Clerk
