

Grand Junction Colo. July. 6. 1877

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment, at six o'clock P. M. Chairman Wadsworth, presiding. On roll call there were found to be present Aldermen, Fells, Starr Meyer, Whorton and Habcock. Absent Mayor Cla, and Aldermen M^r. Kinney & Belle, Wadsworth.

The minutes of the meetings of July 1^o and 2² were read and approved.

A petition for sidewalks in the Western part of town along Main, First and White Streets was read and referred to the St. & A. Committee.

In the report of the St. & A. Committee, it was recommended by them that the Gully on North St. between 4th & 5th Streets be used as a dumping ground. On motion the report was accepted and the City Attorney was instructed to draw up an ordinance making the said Gully on North St. between 4th & 5th Street a dumping ground for the City.

The St. & A. Committee also report that the Heath addition belongs to the City and that the care of the ditches in that addition is the duty of the City.

On motion the Fire & Police committee were instructed to order the supplies for the Fire Company which were ordered at the meeting of June 15.

On motion the Fire & Police Committee were instructed to have the fire Bell properly rung.

On motion Ordinance No. 61. was called up & read & placed on its passage, and was adopted by the following vote: The roll was called as follows: Aldermen voting: Fells, yea; Starr, yea, Meyer, yea, Whorton, yea and Habcock yea.

A motion that a window be cut on the West Side of the City Hall, opposite the door of the Council room, was made & carried & the matter left with the Fire & Police committee.

On motion the St. & Alley committee were instructed to hire a team to haul for the St. Sprinkler, to be used when, in their judgment, it is necessary.

On motion the St. Commissioner was instructed to lime the vaults of the City.

On motion Council adjourned.
