

Grand Junction, Oh. July 13, 1897.

Council met in regular session at 8 o'clock P.M. Chairman Hadsenorth, presiding. Aldermen present: - Fallis, Wells, Meyer, Whorton and Starr. Absent Aldermen: Haddock and M. Kinney and Mayor Cla.

The minutes of the meeting of July 6 were read and approved.

A petition from F. M. Gordon, regarding repairs to his building on Main St. was submitted & read and on motions referred to the Fire & Police committee.

Officers reports for the month of June were read and referred to the Finance Committee.

The Finance Committee reported that the officers reports for the month of May were correct.

The St. & A. committee reported that they had hired a team of Mr. Scovill, for the street sprinkler that can be had & used when needed @ \$3.00 per day.

The St. & A. com. recommended that the sidewalk petition, presented at the last meeting, be granted and that proper resolutions be drawn.

The following resolution was presented & adopted: -

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction.

That a sidewalk be constructed along Main, First and White Streets as follows to wit: -

Beginning at the south west corner of Block 2 in Wobley's first subdivision of said City, thence East along south side of Block 2 to first Street, thence south across White Ave. thence along the West side of first street, south along Block three, of said subdivision, thence south across Road ave, then East across First Street to North west corner of Block 100. Thence south along the east side of First Street and along the west side of said Block 100 to Main Street, thence east along the North side of Main Street and south side of Block 100, to the south east corner of said Block. All of said sidewalk to be six feet in width, except the sidewalk on Main St. which is to be 15 feet in width, and all of said walk to be constructed as provided by ordinance.

The roll was called on the above resolution, resulting as follows. Aldermen voting: - Fallis, yea; Wells, yea; Meyer, yea; Whorton, yea, Starr, yea.
