

Grand Junction, Colo. Dec 21.

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7.30 P. M. Mayor Cole presiding.

Aldermen present: Fialie, Hadcock, Wells, Meyer, Wadsworth, and Harton. Absent - Starr and M^{rs} Kinney.

A petition for liquor license, for a saloon on the corner of 2nd & Colo Ave. was presented & read.

A motion was made that the petition be rejected. The motion being put, The vote resulted as follows. Hadcock, Yea; Fialie, yea; Wadsworth, nay; Wells, nay; Meyer, nay;

Wharton, nay: The motion was lost.

A motion was made to grant the petition.

On motion being put the vote resulted as follows.

Fallis, yea; Hadcock, nay; Hadenworth, yea; Helle, yea; Meyer yea; Wharton, yea: Motion carried.

The Fire and Police Board reported and recommended that the petition for a frame building, on the corner of 2nd & 6th Ave. be granted.

On motion the report was accepted & the petition granted.

The Committee on Saloon Business appointed at previous meeting, recommended that the City Attorney draft an ordinance requiring all screens to be removed during the hours when saloons should be closed.

Alderman Helle made the following motion:

"That City Attorney draft an ordinance requiring the Saloons to remove all screens and keep their windows unobstructed, so that any one can have an unobstructed view of the whole room, from the street, during closing hours, and that there be no connection between a saloon and a Restaurant at any time.

On motion being put the following vote was taken - Alderman voting. Fallis, yea; Hadcock, yea; Hadenworth, Yea; Helle, yea; Meyer, Yea, Wharton, Yea. The motion carried.

The following O. K. D. bills were allowed and the clerk instructed to draw warrants for the same.

A bill No 487 to Star & M^{rs} Kinney for \$120.00 was read and Alderman Hadcock moved the adoption of the following resolution - "Be it resolved by the City Council that the bill of Aldermen Star & M^{rs} Kinney, in the sum of \$120, be and the same is hereby allowed and the clerk be instructed to draw warrant for the same. And be it further resolved that the Special Water Committee, appointed heretofore be and the same is hereby discharged." A motion being put on the above

resolution, the vote was taken as follows: Fallis, yea; Hadcock, yea; Hadenworth, nay; Helle, yea; Meyer, nay; Wharton, nay.

There being a tie in the vote the Mayor cast his vote in the affirmative & the resolution was declared carried.

On motion the City Attorney was instructed to draw up an ordinance restricting the fire limits to between 6th & 8th St. East & West, and Road & 6th Ave. North and South.

On Motion, Ordinance No 64, Continued -

Ald. Wharton objected to the payment of the bill and asked to be allowed to withdraw his O. K. bill. The Mayor's that the matter was a matter of the bill before the City Council.
