History of the Grand Junction City Hall

- 1884 Lowell Elementary School built on Rood Avenue
- 1925 Lowell Elementary is converted to Mesa Junior College
- 1939 City Library built on White Avenue
- 1948 Mesa Junior College Building condemned due to structural problems
- 1950 City of Grand Junction acquires Mesa Junior College Building. The top floor is removed and the building is remodeled and reopened as the Grand Junction City Hall. A renovation project joins the City Library on White with the Lowell Elementary/Mesa Junior College/City Hall building on Rood Avenue. The two buildings are joined into an expanded City Hall.
- 1987 An elevator is added for handicap accessibility
- 1996 A structural engineering study finds the sandstone foundation of the old Lowell Elementary building is crumbling, and the mortar holding the load-bearing masonry walls together is weak.
- 1998 City Council votes to replace both buildings with a new structure in the same location
- 1999 April City employees vacate City Hall for a temporary location while the old structure is demolished
- 2000 August 26 Dedication of a new 48,000 square foot City Hall building
