

Grand Junction Col. Jan. 15. 1898.

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7.30 P.M. Mayor Ela presiding and the following aldermen present: Fallis, Hadcock, Starr, Hadenworth, Wells, Meyer, & Whorton.

Minutes of Jan 11th were read and approved.

A Bill of S. R. Wiles for ^{No. 4152} \$1.35 was allowed & with the bill of the World Safe Co. ^{\$1110.} The Clerk was instructed to draw warrants for the same.

On motion the ^{approval of} minutes of Dec. 21 was reconsidered and ordered corrected to show the introduction of Ord. No. 67, "Amending Sec. 12 of Act 3 of Ord. No. 5."

On motion the approval of the minutes of Dec. 28 was reconsidered and ordered corrected so as to show. The report of the Com. on Fire & Police on Ord. No. 66, Amending Sec. 1 of Ord. No. 6. also that Ord. No. 66, Amending Sec. 1 of Ord. No. 6. was introduced and read.

also - That Ord. No. 68, "concerning Saloons" was introduced and read.

On motion the minutes of Dec. 21 and Dec. 28 as corrected were approved.

On motion Ord. No. 65 Entitled "An Ordinance to amend Sec. 1 of Article 2 of Ordinance No. 7, passed and adopted Sept. 26. 1897" was called up and placed on its passage. The roll was called on the above ordinance with the following result: Ald. voting: - Fallis yea; Hadcock, yea; Starr, yea; Hadenworth yea; Wells, yea; Whorton, yea; Meyer yea; The ordinance was declared passed and adopted.

Ordinance No. 66, Concerning Fire Limits and entitled: - "An Ordinance to Amend Sec. 1 of Ordinance No. 6, passed and adopted Sept. 26. 1897" was called up and placed on its passage. The roll was called on the above ordinance which resulted as follows: - Fallis yea, Hadcock, yea, Starr yea, Hadenworth, yea; Wells, yea; Meyer, yea; Whorton yea.

The Com. on Health, Police Fire reported & recommended the adoption of Ord. No. 65. - Amending Sec. 1 of Ord. No. 7.

Ord. No. 66 was declared passed and adopted.
 On motion Ordinance No. 67. entitled "An ordinance to
 amend Sec. 12 of Article 3 of Ordinance No. 5, passed Sept. 26. 1891,
 which was called up and placed on its passage.

The roll was called on the above ordinance
 which resulted as follows: Aldermen voting: Fallis yea;
 Hadcock, yea; Starr, yea; Wadsworth, yea; Wells, yea;
 Meyer yea; Whorton, yea. Ordinance No. 67. was
 declared passed and adopted.

The License committee reported on the
 Ordinance. - No. 68. concerning saloon screens and
 restaurants in connection with saloons. and
 recommended that Section 1.: relative to restaurants
 be stricken out.

A motion, to amend the report and act on
 the ordinance as read, was made and carried.

On motion the report as amended was
 accepted.

On motion Council proceeded to vote on Ord. No. 68
 by Sections.

Ald. Hadcock moved the adoption of Section I. -
 On motion being put the roll was called with the
 following result: - Fallis yea; Hadcock, yea; Starr nay;
 Wadsworth, yea; Wells, yea; Meyer nay; Whorton nay.
 The motion carried.

On motion to adopt Sec. II the roll was called
 with the following result. Ald. voting: Fallis yea;
 Hadcock yea; Starr, yea; Wadsworth, yea; Wells, yea;
 Meyer yea; Whorton yea. The motion Carried.

On motion to adopt Sec. III, the roll was called
 with the following result: Ald. voting: - Fallis yea,
 Hadcock yea; Starr yea; Wadsworth, yea; Wells, yea;
 Meyer, yea; Whorton, yea. The motion carried.

On motion to adopt Ord. No. 68. in full. The
 roll was called with the following result: Ald. voting:
 Fallis yea; Hadcock, yea; Starr, nay; Wadsworth, yea;
 Wells, yea; Meyer, nay; Whorton, nay. Motion was lost.

A motion was then made to strike out Sec. I.
 relative to Restaurants, and adopt Sections II + III
 as read. The roll was called with the following
 result: Ald voting: - Fallis yea; Hadcock, nay; Starr yea;
 Wadsworth, yea; Wells, nay; Meyer, yea; Whorton yea;

The motion carried and Sec. II and III were
 declared adopted and renumbered Sec. I and II.

Aldermen Starr moved the adoption of the following
 resolution: - "Be it resolved by the City Council, that
 the City Clerk and City Treasurer be instructed
 respectively - not to issue any liquor licenses, or
 to receive or accept liquor license fees, to extend
 beyond the present municipal year, as provided
 by subdivision one eighteen of Section 4403 of Mills Statute."
 Carried

On motion of Alderman Wadsworth the following resolution was offered & adopted:
"Be it resolved that the City Attorney be and is hereby instructed to take the necessary steps to Board the outstanding indebtedness of the City at the next general Election."

Alderman Wadsworth moved the adoption of the following resolution:

"Resolved that we ask the Supreme Court of Colorado in the case of Theodore H. Thomas vs. the City of Grand Junction, appealed from the District Court of Arapahoe County, to take the same up for hearing and determination as soon as possible."

And that the City Clerk, of this City, at once forward to the Clerk of the Supreme Court a Certified Copy hereof."

A motion was made that when we adjourn it be until Thursday night.

On motion a Committee consisting of City attorney, City Physician, ^{Marshal} and Mayor was appointed to take three samples of water, one from a hydrant in town, one from the Grand River and one from the Sumner River, and send them to a competent Chemist for analysis.

On motion of Ald Wadsworth the following resolution was offered and adopted: "Resolved that no bills be allowed for the publication of Ordinances until the necessary affidavits and proof of Publication has been made and filed with the City Clerk."

Mr. Charlton asked that the sum of \$2.50 be appropriated to assist in the publication of 5000 advertising pamphlets, the amount to be paid out of next years funds. On motion being put.

The bond of Chas. Arnett, as night policeman in the sum of five hundred dollars, with Chas. Arnett, J. D. Ackerman & M. Strouse as sureties was read and on motion approved.

On motion Council adjourned until Thursday evening at 7:30.
