

Grand Junction Colo. Jan 20/98

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7:30 P.M. Mayor *de* presiding. In the absence of the Clerk, J. S. Carnahan, was selected Clerk Pro Tem. The roll was called & the following Ald. responded: - Hadcock, Starr, Wadsworth, Wells, Meyer and Whorton.

The Chairman of Fire & Police Com. reported, that they had examined the new fire wagon and stated completed as per contract, and recommended that the bill be paid.

The Bond of Lisher & Murray was presented. moved & seconded to accept the same. The roll was called, resulting as follows: Ald. voting: Hadcock, yea; Starr yea; Wadsworth, yea; Wells, yea; Meyer yea; and Whorton yea.

The Bond of The Grand Junction Liquor Co., ^{assignees of Lisher & Murray} was filed in the sum of Two thousand dollars, with Laib C. Murray, Wm B. Lisher, R. A. Jacob, J. T. Congrove, & Henry G. Wertz, as sureties, was filed. On motion to accept the Bond the roll was called as follows: - Ald. voting: Hadcock, yea; Starr, yea; Wadsworth yea; Meyer, yea; Wells, yea; Whorton, yea.

An Ordinance No. 69. Entitled "An ordinance concerning License and repealing Sec. 1 of Ord. No. 8, Ordinance No. 25, Ordinance No 47 and Ordinance No. 63," was introduced and referred to Committee on License.

On motion the Street & Alley Committee were instructed to look up some lots for Pound Purposes.

A committee from the Fire Department requested an appropriation of \$400.

On motion of Ald. Wadsworth, the matter was left with the Fire & Police Committee to investigate and report.

Alderman Starr moved that a committee be named by the Mayor to confer with the City Attorney as to the New ordinances and to examine the compilation of the Ordinances and report thereon. The motion Carried and the Mayor appointed: Ald. Meyer, Wadsworth and Starr.

On motion Council adjourned until Wednesday evening, Jan. 26, at 7:30 o'clock.
