

Grand Junction, Colo. Mich. 22. 1878.

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7:30 P. M. Mayor Cla presiding.

The following aldermen responded to roll call Fallis, Hadcock, McManney, Starr, Wadsworth, Wells, Meyer, Whorton.

On motion the matter of opening bids for cleaning the streets was left until Wednesday evening March. 23.

The bids on Lots of the City Pound were opened & read. Ald. Starr moved that the proposition of Mr. Whitehead, to sell lots 1, 2, 3, & 4, Block 68, be accepted.

The Roll was called as follows Ald. voting: Fallis yea; Hadcock, yea; Starr, yea; Wadsworth, nay; Wells, not voting, Meyer, nay, Whorton, nay;

There being a tie in the vote, the Mayor's name was called & he cast his vote in the negative, because of the lack of information, relative to the water that could be obtained for those lots.

On motion the matter was referred back to the St. & A. com. for their further investigation & report.

On motion the matter of granting the Saloon Licenses was deferred.

On motion the Clerk was instructed to draw warrants, for bills previously allowed at the meetings held Jan. 11, Feb. 8, & Mich. 8, from the various funds as far as the funds would allow.

The report of J. A. Jewell, on the analysis of the water sent to him for analysis was read and the bill for the same, \$50.00 was presented.

On motion Council adjourned until Wednesday evening March. 23 at 7:30 P. M.
