

Grand Junction Colo. March. 23/1878.

The City Council met pursuant to Adjournment at 7:30 P. M. Mayor Cla presiding. The following aldermen responded to roll call: - Fallis, Hadcock, M^{rs} Kinney, Starr, Wadsworth, Wells, Meyer, Whorton.

On motion the proposition of Mr. Whitehead for Lots 1, 2, 3, & 4 in Block 68. with water & Hydrant in the Lot, for \$75:00 in City Warrant, to be used as a City Pound was accepted. The Roll was called as follows: - Fallis yea, Hadcock, yea; M^{rs} Kinney yea; Starr, yea; Wadsworth, yea, Wells, yea, Meyer, yea; Whorton, yea.

Alderman Wadsworth made the following motion that the Clerk be instructed, that when procuring the ballots on the "Purchase of the Water Works", there be inserted the words "for \$55,000." after the word "Works"

so that the ballot will read "For the Purchase of the Water Works for \$35,000.00" and "Against the Purchase of the Water Works for \$35,000.00"

The roll was called resulting as follows: - Alderman voting: - - - Fallis, nay; Hadcock, nay; W. Kinney, nay; Starr, nay; Wadsworth, yea; Wells, nay; Meyer, yea. Whorton yea. The motion was lost.

Bids for Cleaning the Streets for the Season of 1898. were opened and read.

It was found that the bid of C. M. White, to do the work, as required in the Specifications, for \$1100.⁰⁰/₁₀₀ was the lowest bid. On motion to accept his bid the roll was called which resulted as follows: -

Ald. voting: - Fallis yea, Hadcock, yea; W. Kinney, yea; Starr, yea; Wadsworth, yea; Wells, yea; Meyer, yea; Whorton, yea. The work was let to C. M. White.

On motion Mr. Wheeler was permitted to withdraw the applications for Saloon Licenses.

On motion the petition of Mr. Wadsworth to erect a corrugated Iron building in the rear of his warehouse, was granted.

On motion Council Adjourned.
