

Graud. Junction Colo May 16<sup>th</sup> 1898

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Ela. in chair. Upon motion by alderman McKimney Geo. A. Currie was declared as alderman to fill place of alderman wills from third ward and clerk was instructed to place the name of Geo. A. Currie upon the roll + On roll call the following responded = Mayor Ela. Alderman Ramey, Weyer, Whorton, Dickerson, McKimney + Starr + Hadcock and Currie

Minutes of meeting of May 2<sup>nd</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> were read approved with corrections + A petition from 8 + citizens asking City Council to appropriate \$ 200.<sup>00</sup> from City funds to pay Keller Institute Band to furnish music once a week during Season of 1898 was read + Alderman Starr made motion that a Committee of 3 be appointed by Mayor to confer with County Commissioners to see if they would help pay for music to be furnished by Keller Institute Band. The Mayor appointed an above committee alderman Currie + Weyer + Ramey Alderman Weyer made motion to amend alderman Starr motion that Council would pay Keller Institute Band \$ 150.<sup>00</sup> for music for season of 1898 upon roll call the vote was as follows alderman Ramey + Weyer + Whorton + Dickerson McKimney Hadcock and Currie voting yea and alderman Starr nay

Reports of the following City Officers were read and approved Marshall W. Mann. City Engineer F. P. Knuckles Fire Chief John Bines. The report of City Treasurer was read and a motion by alderman Starr same was referred to Finance Committee

The Committee on ordinance # an ordinance to amend ordinance # 52 entitled "an ordinance concerning fowls"; passed and adopted Apr 25. 1896 reported favorable.

On motion by alderman Whorton report of Committee was accepted +

Committee on an ordinance # an ordinance to amend Sub-Division 14 of Sec 1- of ordinance # 69. passed 2/9-1898 reported favorable + On motion report of Committee was accepted + Alderman Starr made report on Bill of S. M. White for \$ 200.<sup>00</sup> for work on his street contract The report was unfavorable + on motion by alderman Hadcock report from alderman Starr was accepted +

On motion by alderman Hadcock the order to build side walk in front of Lot 9 in Block 123 was revoked + a communication from Fire Department was read recommending H. B. Jones Fire Chief Ed. R. Welsh Janitor Perry Rodgers = Supervisor. Alderman McKimney made motion that Council ratify recommendations of Fire Department Alderman Currie made motion to amend Ald. McKimney's motion to lay the communication over + The amendment carried and communication referred to Fire Police Board +
