

July 19th 1898

City Council met at 8 O'clock P.M. with Mayor W.P. Ede in the chair and upon roll being called the following Alderman answer present, namely, Currie, Wadeock, Dickerson, Ramay Wharton, Starr and McKinney - absent Meyer.

City Clerk Delaplaine being absent on account of sickness it was moved and seconded that J.S. Carnahan act as Clerk. Protester motion put and carried. The minutes of the meetings of July 5th and July 12, were ~~read~~ read and approved. The Report of the City-Treasurer for the Month of June (1898) was read and referred with cancelled warrants to the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee by its Chairman reported on Bill referred to it at the last meeting and approved the same, as follows.

The Chairman of Special water committee reported that they were no new developments in the matter of purchase of water plant - Ordinance No 79 entitled an Ordinance to Repeal Ordinance No 74 was then introduced and referred to Special Water Committee, and it was moved seconded and carried that when the Council adjourns it adjourns to meet at 8 O'clock Wednesday evening July 27th 1898. It was moved and seconded that B.L. Gray and Mr Hoover be allowed to address the Council. Carried.

Alderman Wadeock then introduced the following resolution - "Whereas the Chairman of the Chairman of the Street and Alley Committee has directed that the Parties John Gray & B.L. Clark who are cleaning Cess Pools in the City - under orders of the City-Council heretofore made, shall dump the same in the Grand River at the foot of Main Street, as far as possible from the Barber's Shop. And said parties having acted under said direction. Therefore Be it Resolved by the City-Council that the foot of Main Street in the Grand River, as far from shore as possible and in the main channel of said River

Be established for said dumping ground for all parties for such purposes."

Alderman Keadeck moved the adoption of the resolution, same was recorded, and the motion being put the following vote was taken

 It was moved that the Privy vault at the City Hall be cleared, seconded and carried =

It was moved that the attorney write out and the Marshall serve notice on ditch Co. or parties owning the ^{privy vaults} Migration Ditch, requiring the same to be removed from the City - Currie's motion seconded and carried =
