The Finance Committee made the following recommendations on the annual appropriation ordinance for the fiscal year beginning April 1st 1899 and ending March 31st 1900. to wit

- First. For the purpose of maintaining a Police force. \$ 1800.⁰⁰
- Second. For the purpose of maintaining improving and repairing streets, avenues alleys crossings, side walks ditches Public Parks and water for Irrigation \$ 2000.⁰⁰
- Third. For lighting Streets & Public buildings \$ 1400.⁰⁰
- Fourth. For maintenance of Fire Department \$ 700.⁰⁰
- Fifth. For Fees and salaries other than Police \$ 450.⁰⁰
- Sixth. For City General Fund \$ 6165.⁰⁰
- Seventh. For Interest on warrants \$ 1100.⁰⁰
- Eighth. For Interest on Bonds \$ 3900.⁰⁰

upon motion by alderman Starr and seconded by alderman McKinney the above appropriation ordinance was passed and adopted by the following vote.

upon motion by alderman Headcock and seconded by alderman Starr the Purchasing Committee were instructed to ascertain what they could purchase 1000 to 6000 feet lumber to be use on St crossings and report at our next meeting Carried

upon motion by alderman Starr, ^{Council} took a recess of 5 minutes.
 upon motion by alderman Hodgecock and seconded by alderman Dickerson the following places were designated to hold Spring Election at
 First Ward. Back building on South side of main St between 2nd and 3rd Sts 245 main Street +
 Second Ward. Brunswick Hotel sample room on fourth between main and Road Streets.
 West Third Ward at Grand Valley Produce Co building on main Street between 4th and 5th Streets +
 East Third Ward. at Stulls carpenter shop. corner main and 7th Streets.
