

Resolved By the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that
an Election be and is hereby called to be held at the City Hall
in the City of Grand Junction Monday Sept 11th 1899 between
the hours of 1 am and 7 P.M. of said day at which election
shall be submitted to the qualified voters in said city who have
paid taxes during the preceding year upon property in said

Alderman's City the question of the settlement of all matters between the
Resolution to Grand Junction Water Co and the City of Grand Junction so buying
leave the its Water works and System at a total cost for a settlement
Water Company to purchase of not to exceed \$50,000 Dollars to also to
to the people construct a Mountain Water system in accordance with

the Phillips Plan to the total cost of all above said not to
exceed \$116,000 Dollars and issue Bonds therefor to
be it further resolved that the City Clerk shall provide ballots
for use of the voters at said election upon which shall
be printed the words - For Settlement of Water Question
and Mountain Water - Against settlement of Water Question
and Mountain Water with a suitable square opposite each
in which the voter shall place across in said square and
be it further resolved that the City Clerk publish a notice
of this election in one daily paper in the city and
also in the official paper of the city as soon as possible
to until said election day which notice shall include a
copy of this resolution and that said City Clerk procure
from the proper officers for use at said election

Certified list of voters and set papers for use of election
judges. Alderman ^{Starr} moved the adoption and seconded
by Alderman Mc Kinney the roll was called and
the vote was as follows: Lorry yes, Mc Kinney yes,
Starr yes, Smith yes and Ramsey Nay. Voted
upon motion by Alderman Smith carried and adjourned to
Sept 3rd 1899 at 8 P.M.
