property to the city for the sum of Forty nine Thousand Six Hundred Dollars {49600.00} and, without further consideration to release all claims against the city, including hydrant rentals, and to dismiss all lawsuits now pending, at its own expense, with the exception of one suit in which the costs are to be divided; and further proposes to turn the possession of said plant and property over to the city and receive the purchase price when the title to the same shall be found to be free and clear from all incumbrances:

That the proposition, to purchase said plant and property for the sum of Forty nine Thousand Six Hundred Dollars {49600.00} under the above conditions, be submitted to the qualified electors, who are Tax-payers under the laws to be voted upon at a special election to be held in said city on the 16th day of September A.D. 1899, from seven O'clock in the forenoon until seven O'clock in the afternoon of said day; that said election be held at City Hall corner Colorado Avenue and Fifth Street. That C.P. McCarry, W. J. Brown and W.A. Alby be and are hereby appointed as judges of said election

That the City Clerk be instructed to procure from the County Treasurer a certified copy of the tax-payers entitled to vote, and that the same be furnished to said judges. All persons voting to purchase said water works and property shall have written or printed on their ballot the words "For the purchase of the water works. and all persons voting against the purchase of said water works and property shall have written or printed upon their ballots the words "Against the purchase of the water works." Alderman McKinney moved the adoption of above Resolution and seconded by Alderman Carby. Alderman Whorton made substitute motions and seconded by Alderman Brown that new water works begin on the Gunnison River and build same north into the city as far as the \$65000.00 would allow under the Phillips or Allen plans.

The roll was called upon the Whorton motion and vote was as follows. Brown yea. Smith yea. Starr yea. Whorton yea. McKinney nay. Carby nay. Lost.

The roll was called upon the McKinney Resolution and the vote was as follows Brown yea. Smith yea. Starr yea. Whorton nay. McKinney yea. Carby yea. The motion was carried.

Upon motion by Ald. McKinney City Clerk was instructed to notify Marshall Marsh to attend Council meetings and state reason why it had not attended Council meetings. Alderman Brown made motion adjourn until regular meeting seconded by Whorton. Alderman McKinney made substitute motion and seconded by Alderman Smith that Council adjourn until Sept 8th at 8 P.M. The McKinney motion carried.

Alderman Carby made the following motion and seconded by Ald. McKinney that the contract for water works be awarded to Bates & Co. subject to such changes as the City Council may deem proper. The Council with amendment may find it necessary to make such changes as they may deem proper. The motion was carried.
