x Whereas

the amount of money now available viz \$65000.00 is not
sufficient for the construction of a good and sufficient
water works for the city of Grand Junction taking as its
source of supply the waters of the Gunnison River
in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore
adopted by the City Council and

Whereas

certain citizens have offered and proposed to the Council to
take sufficient of the legally issued Bonds of this city
for the completion of said system of water works at par

and Whereas

it is deemed necessary for the complete erection and
equipment of said system of water works that
the issuance of an additional amount of Twenty Two
Thousand Dollars (\$22000.00) of Bonds of the city are
necessary.

Therefore

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction
that an election be and the same is hereby called to be
held at the various polling places in each voting
precinct within the city on Tuesday November 7th 1899
the polls to be open from seven o'clock in the morning
until seven o'clock in the evening of said day.
qualified Electors in this city who are tax payers
under the law, the question of completion of said
water works system and the issuing of Bonds
hereto in an additional amount of \$22000.00 in the
same form as near as may be with those heretofore
issued for this purpose and bearing Five per cent
per annum payable semi annuities - payable in

Ten (10) years at the option of the city and absolutely due in fifteen (15) years from date of issue-

The city clerk shall provide a sufficient number of Ballots for use at said Election which Ballots shall have printed thereon the words: For the Completion of Garrison Water works and issuing \$22,000.00 Bonds.

Against the Completion of Garrison Water works and the issuing of \$22,000.00 Bonds. with a suitable square opposite each in which the voter shall designate his choice by a suitable X therein.

The city clerk shall also provide the Judges of said Election in each voting Precinct in the city with a separate Ballot Box in which shall be deposited all ballots cast upon this question and no other. The said city clerk shall also provide certified lists for each City Precinct of the Tax payers. Provided that he shall copy and verify the list furnished by the County Treasurer for here at the election held

September 16 1899

The ^{election} judges heretofore appointed or that may be appointed by the County Commissioners of Mesa County Colorado for the General Election to be held Nov 7 1899

for the various wards and precincts within the city of Grand Junction are hereby appointed as judges of this election in each of their respective wards and and returns thereof shall be certified and made to the city clerk accordingly. The city clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of this election by publication in the Grand Junction News for a period of not less than thirty 30 days prior to said election which notice shall contain the substance of this Resolution.

Alderman Ramey made motion and seconded by Alderman Browner that Resolution be adopted. Same was adopted by the following vote. Browner yea. Barry yea. Smith yea. Starr yea. Ramey yea. Whorton yea. Carved. X

upon motion by Alderman Ramey Clerk was instructed to answer Thurston. Hutton and Williams letter pertaining to Bonds.

upon motion by Alderman Smith Council took ordinance # 86 and 87 concerning Sewers. Alderman Smith moved the adoption and passage of Ordinance # 86. Seconded by Alderman Starr. No action was taken on Ordinance # 86.

Alderman Starr made motion that city atty Barnahan take all steps necessary and if he needs any legal help to also secure same, in case of Grand Junction Water Co vs city of Grand Junction. The motion carried by the following vote. Browner yea. Barry yea. Smith yea. Starr yea. Ramey yea and Whorton yea.
