

Grand Junction Colo Nov 14th 1899.

Regular meeting of City Council Mayor Eba in Chair upon roll call the following alderman responded Prommer, Cory, Dickerson, McKinney, Smith, Starr, Ranney and Whorton alderman Whorton protested against the names of A.S. McKinney and R.E. Starr names being on the roll and called and insist that names of McBarry and Kiffin be called in their places.

The mins were not read. The monthly reports of the following officers were read and read M.B. Barton Junitor, Alver S. Mann P.M. J.W. Pearce, City Treasure, City Marshall W.M. Mann upon motion by alderman Cory and seconded by alderman McKinney the reports were referred to the Finance Committee. Carried upon motion by alderman Smith the Drumm was given power to take Fire Wagon to shop and have repairs made.

Alderman Smith introduced ~~the~~ Ordinance # 88 an Ordinance to Contract an indebtedness on behalf of the City of Grand Junction by issue of its bonds in the sum of \$22000⁰⁰ to raise money for the completion of the water works plant and system known as the Gunnison River System of water works for fire domestic and other purposes, to be forever owned managed and operated by said City.

Ordinance # 88
