

Grand Junction Colo  
May 21 1900

Adjourned meeting of the City Council, Mayor  
Clair in the chair. Upon Roll Call the following  
Aldermen responded, Ald Barton, Bromser, Levey,  
Dickerson, Lee, Shores, Wharton. Absent Ald Smith.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Moved by Bromser and seconded by Lee  
That the regular order of business be suspended  
and we take up the matter of a pump man with the  
unanimous consent of the Council Carried

Moved by Dickerson and seconded by Bromser  
That the resignation of J. H. Lawrence be accepted and  
placed on file. Carried

The following application for the  
position as pump man were then read.

John Facer Received six votes and declared Elected  
J A Merrill Received two votes.  
T A Snook

Moved by Barton and seconded Dickerson  
That we proceed to ballot on a pump man. Carried  
Ordinance No 97, <sup>being an Ordinance for the purpose of appointing a pump man</sup> was read by Alderman  
Bromser <sup>district no two of the city of Grand Junction</sup> who moved the adoption of the same

Moved and seconded that Mr Sturimety  
be allowed to address the Council Carried

Moved by Barton and seconded that  
the Ordinance be referred to the water loan. Carried

Moved by Bromser and seconded by Levey  
That the bill of the Great Falls Co for 17<sup>35</sup> for express  
on pump fixtures be allowed and warrant drawn  
for same.

Amendment by Barton and seconded by  
Lee that the amount be deducted from the reserve  
of 5% of contract price. A vote was then taken on  
and resulted as follows Ald Barton yea Bromser yea  
Levey yea Dickerson yea Lee yea Wharton yea. Carried

The vote on the Raymond motion was as follows  
Barton yea Bromser yea Levey yea Dickerson yea  
Lee yea Wharton yea Carried

Moved and seconded that the communication  
from Mr Emanuel regarding a pump be referred to  
the water loan.

Moved by Barton and seconded by Dickerson  
That the City Attorney be instructed to draw  
up a contract with the Worthington Pump Co. for a  
pump, the same to be forth coming as per their  
letter of May 8 1900, the pump to raise 1,600,000 gal  
water of water to reservoir in twenty four hours  
and that the Mayor and Clerk sign same.

A vote being taken upon the foregoing motion was as follows Ald Barton yea Broemser yea Lovey yea Dickerson yea Lee yea Wharton yea Carried

Moved by Barton and seconded by Lee That the bill of O'Neil & Thomas for two dollars and Carrie Warren for one hundred dollars be disallowed, upon the report of the City Attorney "That there is no liability on the part of the City, concerning these bills," as the City had no notice" Carried.

Moved by Wharton and seconded by Barton That the purchasing com purchase 150 feet of  $\frac{3}{4}$  in pipe for <sup>on purchase of lime</sup> Bennett that he dig trenches and lay same. A vote being taken it resulted as follows Ald Barton yea Broemser yea Lovey yea Dickerson yea Lee yea Wharton yea Carried.

Moved by Barton and seconded by Broemser That the report of the City Engineer on plastering Man holes and flush tanks on the sewer be referred to the Water com. with power to act. A vote being taken it resulted as follows Ald Barton yea Broemser yea Lovey yea Dickerson yea Lee yea Wharton yea Carried

Moved by Barton and seconded by Broemser That the report of the City Engineer on the measurement of pipe lines be referred to the Water Com. Carried

Moved and seconded That Mr. Reuther be allowed to address the council on the purchase of lime Carried

Moved by Broemser and seconded by Wharton. That the purchase of lime be referred to the Purchasing com. with power to act. A vote was then taken which resulted as follows Ald Barton yea Broemser yea Lovey yea Dickerson yea Lee yea Wharton yea Carried

Moved by Broemser and seconded by Wharton That the purchase of coal for pumping plant be referred to the Purchasing com. with power to act A vote was then taken which resulted as follows Ald Barton yea Broemser yea Lovey yea Dickerson yea Lee yea Wharton yea Carried
