Regular meeting of the City Council.  
Mayor Day in the chair. Upon roll call the following aldermen responded Barton, Covey, Dickerson, Lee, Shores, Smith and Wharton, Absent Broemser.

Minutes of July 18 read and approved  
Moved and seconded that the City Marshalls, Janitor, Treasurer, and Police Magistrate reports be referred to the Finance Com. Carried  
Moved by Wharton and seconded by Smith that Street Com. be instructed to lay side walk along lots 1 to H in Block 52  
A vote being taken resulted as follows Barton voted yea, Covey, yea, Dickerson yea Lee yea Shores yea Smith yea Wharton yea Carried  
Moved and seconded that all new bills be referred to Finance Committee Carried

Ordinance No 98 being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Licenses" was then read and laid on the table for 5 days

Moved by Barton and Seconded by Smith that the amount of \$1322<sup>33</sup> being the amount here to fore taken from the General Fund for sewer purposes be replaced in the General fund from the amount derived from the sale of sewer bonds. A vote was taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows Barton voted yea, Levey yea, Dickerson, yea, Lee, yea, Shores, yea, Smith, yea, Wharton yea. Carried

Moved and seconded a warrant be drawn on the General fund for \$500<sup>00</sup> to pay freight on new pump. A vote was taken which was as follows Barton voted yea, Levey yea, Dickerson yea, Lee yea, Shores yea, Smith yea, Wharton yea. Carried

Moved and seconded that Mrs. Lossabaum be employed to set up new pump at the rate of \$5 per day and board. A vote was taken which resulted as follows Barton voted yea, Levey yea, Dickerson yea, Lee yea, Shores, yea, Smith yea, Wharton yea. Carried

Moved and seconded that any person present may address the Council Carried

Moved and seconded That the matter of the extension of new water mains on 4th and 4th street be referred to the water Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded That the request of Jol. Champliner for the City Park and two special Officers for Peach week be granted. A vote was taken which was as follows Barton voted yea, Levey yea, Dickerson yea, Lee yea, Shores yea, Smith yea, Wharton yea. Carried

Moved and seconded That Dr. E. F. Eldridge be allowed to erect a flag pole in the childrens park and that the City dig the hole six by six for same. A vote was taken which resulted as follows Barton voted yea, Levey yea, Dickerson yea, Lee yea, Shores yea, Smith yea, Wharton yea. Carried

Moved by Barton and seconded by Wharton that the following proposal be made to the U. S. Government to furnish water to the Indian School at this place

Sir:

The City of Grand Junction will furnish the Grand Junction Indian Training School with water for domestic purposes for a period of ten years subject to the approval from year to year of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs and the City Council of the City of Grand Junction but said contract not to be annulled in any case with less than six months written notice except there shall fail to be an appropriation of money by Congress for which payment can be made for said water in which case the City of Grand Junction retains the right to disconnect pipes and cease such supply at once, such water to be furnished at meter rate of 15¢/fifteen cents per one thousand (1000) gallons.

The quality of water to be the same as that supplied by the City water works to its consumers in the City of Grand Junction.

The water to be measured by a three inch meter known as the "Trident," to be placed within the boundary lines of the school land and the payments to be made on the first of each quarter and based on the reading of the meter, said meter to be furnished by the United States.

In case new pipe is required between said mains and the meter, the same shall be furnished by the Indian School except it be necessary for the City to extend its mains for the accommodation of its customers along the line of pipe now belonging to the United States Government and used as service pipe to the Indian School. In case an extension should be necessary for the accommodation of City consumers, then the pipe shall be furnished without expense to the United States Government or Indian School. The same shall be not less than four inches in diameter and shall be put in place without expense to the Government and without interference to the flow of water to the school for any length of time greater than that absolutely necessary to disconnect the present pipe and make connections with the extended mains of the City. When such connection is completed, the pipe belonging to the Government between the original point of connection <sup>and the later point of connection</sup> shall be removed from the ground, disconnected in sections and turned over to the Superintendent of the Indian School for removal.

In case the pipe line of the City within the City limits becomes frozen or out of repair the Superintendent of the School shall immediately give to the Superintendent of the City Water Works written notice thereof, and if the same shall not be repaired in three days, all rentals for the quarter in which such neglect may occur may be withheld by the Superintendent, and adjusted by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs providing a statement of the facts of the case shall be sent forward promptly at the close of the quarter to the Commissioner's Office and a duplicate copy thereof transmitted to the Superintendent of the City Water Works.

Provided, however, that the City of Grand Junction will not be responsible for the acts of the County of Mesa or the Grand Valley Irrigation Company or any one else out side of the City limits of Grand Junction in removing dirt or covering from said pipe line thereby increasing the danger to the line by frost. And in case the normal condition of the line shall be changed by acts of others and the line becomes frozen as a result of such acts, then the same shall be repaired by the school without recourse upon the City.

It is further provided and agreed that if at any time during the life of this agreement it should be deemed advisable by the Superintendent of the School that its present pipe should be taken out and replaced or repaired or replaced by larger pipe, then the right and privilege to open present trenches along present lines or along the lines near the curbs of any street within the City of Grand Junction which may be selected by the Superintendent as a proper course for such pipe lines, the right to such action on the part of the Superintendent of the School is hereby conceded and granted provided only that while such trenches may be open, the Superintendent of the School shall maintain such danger signals along the line of such openings as required by ordinance made and provided in other cases within the City limits, providing <sup>however</sup> such ditches or trenches shall be opened and closed with such dispatch as will not for an unreasonable time in any way interfere with or discommode the citizens of Grand Junction for a longer period than may be necessary to do the work in a proper manner, and, in no case,

other than a temporary repair, not requiring more than three days labor, shall the Superintendent without first serving written notice upon the City open such mains or lines.

It is further provided that all pipe lines in which the pipe is bought and paid for by the United States government shall belong entirely and exclusively to the Indian School and at no time and under no consideration shall the City of Grand Junction or any Citizen there of remove, replace, cut, drill, nor attach thereto any other pipe for the service and accommodation of any institution or Citizen without the written consent of the Superintendent of the Indian School, endorsed by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

It is further provided that payment shall be made by the Superintendent of the Indian School within thirty days after the first day of ~~each~~ quarter of the fiscal year.

A vote was then taken on the foregoing proposition which resulted as follows
