

Grand Junction, Colo. September 24<sup>th</sup> 1895

Council met pursuant to adjournment, Mayor W. K. Allison  
presiding. An roll call the following were found to be  
present. Alderman Wharton, Deane, Lee, Joe Croy,  
Caterone, Pratt, Boston and Genevieve, and Mayor Allison

The Fire and Police Committee then submitted a  
report of the damaged and dangerous condition of  
The Chipman building located on lot 8, Block 118.

The yeas and nays were then called for on the  
following resolution. Resolved that the Chipman  
building, located on lot 8, Block 118 by reason of natural  
decay has become unsafe and dangerous to individuals  
passing along the street and to the life of persons  
doing business therein and to adjacent buildings  
in the vicinity thereof, and that the same be and is  
hereby declared a nuisance, and the City Marshal  
is instructed to serve notice upon the owners of

The building to abate the same". Alderman voting were  
 Wharton yes, Dunn yes, Lee yes, McCury yes, Coleman yes,  
 Pault yes, Burton yes, Gunnor yes, Mayor's score. *(and)*  
 The resolution was declared adopted.

On motion of Alderman Burton, Sec. by Alderman  
 Wharton The Street and Alley Committee were instructed  
 to confer with The School Board with a view of getting  
 them to build a sidewalk along the North and South  
 sides of The school block.

On motion of Alderman McCury Sec. by Alderman  
 Wharton Council adjourned to Friday Evening Sept. 27<sup>th</sup>  
 1895. at 7.30 P.M.
