Broenser.

Minutes of October 1 read and

Moved and seconded that Mrs
W. T. Carpenter be allowed to address the council
on the extension of time to build new side walk
on West main street Carried.

Moved and seconded That Mr A
Struthers be allowed to address the Council
on the matter of water for the Rail Road lco.
for fire protection and other purposes Carried.

Moved and seconded That the
Rail Road lco. be allowed to use city water
for fire protection and that the place of con-
nection to the mains be designated by the city.
Carried.

Moved and seconded That the petition
for an extension of water mains on Cheyenne
and 7th to 9th be referred to water committee
Carried.

Moved and seconded That the applica-
tion of W. W. Wilhelmy for a malt liquor license
be referred to the License Committee. Carried.

Moved and seconded That the
election of Edward Jones by the Fire Depart-
ment as Assistant Chief be confirmed Carried.

For all new work where Garrison & Fletcher received \$12.20 I will furnish same material and perform same labor for the sum of Ten and 4/100 (10.40). For each additional size of orifice thirty first 3000 extra wj; for 7/8" orifice add 30¢ to above, for 3/4" add 70¢.

For connecting old to new where Garrison and Fletcher received \$4.50 I will furnish same material and perform same labor for the sum of Three and 7/100 dollars (3.70), and furnish new covers for stop boxes for .35¢ additional
