The following communication was received from Benton Canon regarding the Street car and rail way.

Grand Junction
Dear Sir

Concerning the property of the Grand Junction Street Rail Way Co in your city of which we recently talked I will make the following proposition to the city.

I will sell the horse, harness and two street cars for one hundred dollars and will surrender all rights thereunder and franchise and track as

it stands at this time, at the price the rails would bring, second hand on the market, which I presume would be about (30) thirty %⁰⁰ dollars per ton. I think there is a little over thirty tons of rails, thirty dollars is the price for second hand rails in Denver and they sell at thirty five dollars, while it is true I offered the property at one time for \$500⁰⁰. I did not think there was as many rails on the line as there was when I came to measure the track, and figured it up. I would be glad to have you lay this matter before the Council and advise me at an early day as to the wishes of your Board in this matter. If the City is disposed to buy this property, would be glad if your Council would appoint a committee with authority to act, as I wish to use some of the track in the Palisade Coal mine if I do not make a deal with the City. Carried

Moved and seconded that Geo Yates be allowed to address the Council. Carried

Moved and seconded that Geo Yates be allowed \$2 per month barn rent for team and \$10 per ton for hay for the team. A vote was taken on the above motion which was as follows Barton voted yea Broemser yea Covey yea Lee yea Shores yea Smith yea Wharton yea. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the matter of arranging a rate for water motors and securing meters be refered to the Water Committee with power to act. Carried

Moved and seconded that at any time the City's team is idle, that the same be used to haul rock and stone to some convenient place for a stone pile. Carried
