

Grand Junction Colo  
Dec. 24 1900

Adjourned meeting of the City Council  
Mayor Cla in the chair. Upon Roll call the  
following Aldermen responded, Barton,  
Lovey, Dickerson, Shores, Smith and Wharton  
absent fee.

Moved and seconded We dispense  
with the reading of the minutes of the previous  
meeting carried

Moved and seconded That we dispense  
with the regular order of business and take  
up the passage of the assessment ordinance  
in Sewer Districts One and Two. Carried

Moved and seconded That Ordinance  
No 99, assessing the cost of the construction of Sanitary  
sewer District No 1 against the Real Estate in that District  
be placed upon its passage. Carried

Moved and seconded That Ordinance No.  
100, assessing the cost of the construction of Sanitary  
sewer District No 2, against the Real Estate in said  
District be placed upon its passage. Carried

Moved and seconded. That Ordinance  
No 99, Being a Bill for an ordinance, assessing  
the cost of the District Sanitary Sewer, with the  
appurtenances, in and for sewer District No. One  
of the City of Grand Junction, Colo. be adopted  
as read. A vote was then on the passage  
of the Ordinance which was as follows, Barton  
voted yea, Lovey, yea, Dickerson yea, Shores yea,  
Smith yea, Wharton yea. Carried.

Moved and seconded. That Ordinance  
No 100, Being a Bill for an Ordinance, assessing  
the cost of the District Sanitary Sewer, with the  
appurtenances, in and for sewer District No  
Two of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado,  
as read. A vote was then taken on the  
passage of the above ordinance which was  
as follows Barton voted yea, Lovey yea,  
Dickerson yea, Shores yea, Smith yea, Wharton  
yea. Carried

Moved by Barton and seconded  
by Lovey. That the people living on Orchard  
Mesa be permitted to tap water mains under  
rules and regulations as in the City and  
that a rate of \$2.00 per room and .40 per  
lot but no house to be charged less than  
\$1.00 per month, stock to be charged .15 per head  
per month. A vote was then taken which  
was as follows. Barton voted yea, Lovey yea, Dickerson  
yea, Shores yea, Smith excused from Council, Wharton yea. Carried

Moved and seconded That a warrant be drawn on the water fund in favor of A. N. Buckler for the amount available as per bills allowed for tapping  
A vote was taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Lovey yea, Dickerson yea Shoes yea Wharton yea  
Carried. And of Bill \$230.00

Moved and seconded That the bonds of J. J. Moody and P. A. Whittier as plumbers be approved and license granted Carried

Moved seconded That Gracy and Merrick be permitted to do plumbing until next regular meeting of the City Council on account of their surety bond not having been returned from the East Carried

The following resolution was then introduced

Whereas in and by the contract here to fore awarded for the construction of the improvements in Sanitary Sewer Districts Numbers one and Two of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, It is provided that payment for said improvements shall be made to the contractor in public improvement bonds or warrants of said City drawn upon the funds of said districts in monthly installments of ninety per cent of all money due for work done during the preceding month under and in accordance with the provisions and stipulations of said contract based upon monthly estimates of the work completed and certified to by the Engineer and approved by the City Council

And, Whereas the remaining ten per cent of said contract price was due on the 1 day of December A. D. 1900. Therefore

Resolved that the following described bonds be issued and delivered to the Contractor namely:

Wast Sewer No 1	
Bonds Number - 39 - and - 37 both	
(2 bonds) for the sum of \$500.00 each	\$1,000.00
District Sewer No 2	
Bonds Number - 20 to - 25 - both Inclusive	
(6 Bonds) for the sum of \$500.00 each	\$3,000.00
Total Bonds Two Districts	
→ Total (8 Bonds,)	\$4,000.00

For which when issued The Contractor shall give the Treasurer a good and sufficient receipt.

A vote was then taken on the foregoing resolution which was as follows Barton voted yea Lovey yea Dickerson yea Shoes yea Wharton yea Carried

On account of said deferred payments, the remaining \$1398.00 not to be issued until after April 1st 1901 and not until after said contractor shall have properly settled the books and bonded the alley in accordance with the terms of said contract

Moved and seconded That the following  
 saloon men Paynet & Kane, James Purcell, Jas H. McGroves  
 J. E. Sulman and The Grand Junction Liquor Company be  
 rebated \$35<sup>00</sup> as the amount paid on double license  
 which closed. A vote was taken on the foregoing  
 motion which was as follows Barton voted yea  
 Broenser entered her. Broenser voted yea Levy Inway  
 Dickerson yea Shores yea Wharton yea Carried  
 Moved and seconded we adjourn until  
 next regular meeting Jan 8 1901 Carried
