Ajourned meeting of the City Council Mayor
Sampliner in the Chair upon Roll call the following
Aldermen responded Barton Hards Hutchinson Mantey
Shaw and Waldroup Absent Dickerson.

Minutes of previous meeting read and
approved

The petition for a new side walk and two
crossings on Main in front of block 113 was received
and upon motion referred to the Street and Alley Committee

The petition for an extension of water mains
in Crawford and Mobley's addition to Bisher Arnett and
others was upon motion referred to the Water
Committee

Moved and seconded That the petition from
the residents living out side of Keith's addition and inside
of the City be give ten inches of water instead of
twenty as asked for in petition Carried

The Report of the Chief of the Fire Depart-
ment and recommendations was upon motion referred
to the Fire and Police Committee.

Moved and seconded that J. G. Broemser
be heard upon the matter of extending the water mains
in Block 8 Carried

Moved and seconded That the extension
of water mains in Block 8 be referred to the Water Com-
mittee with power to act. A vote was then taken
which was as follows Barton voted yea Hards yea
Hutchinson yea Mantey yea Shaw yea Waldroup yea
Carried

The License Committee reported favorable upon the Application and Bond of Walter Wilhelm for a malt liquor license which upon motion and duly seconded the application granted and Bond approved by the following vote Barton voted yea Harbo yea Hutchinson nay Mantey yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

The Purchasing Committee reported as follows upon music for Sacred Sunday Concerts That there be three prizes given as follows First Prize \$60.00 Second \$50.00 Third 40.00 Bands to play alternate on Sundays afternoons. The Mayor to appoint three Judges to award prizes The Judges to use score cards of 100 points each The Band receiving the most points to be given first prize, the one receiving the second largest number of points second prize and the one receiving the lowest number third prize The Purchasing Com. report was upon Motion duly seconded and accepted.

The following Amendment offered by Ald Barton and Secud. ^{per} Mantey was then offered That the pay for the Sunday Concerts come from the salary of the Mayor and Aldermen ^{The vote was as follows} Barton voted yea Harbo yea Hutchinson nay Mantey yea Shores nay Waldroup yea Carried The vote on the original motion ^{as amended} was as follows Barton voted yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Mantey yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

Alderman Lee entered Council here.

Moved and seconded that A. L. Gourley be allowed to address the Council upon the matter of free water from the city water mains for use on Orchard Mesa Cemetery Carried

Moved and seconded that the request of A. L. Gourley be referred to the Water Committee Carried

A communication was received and read from S. G. McMullen informing the Council of the probable visit of the American Bar Association of the United States this fall and asking the Council to cooperate with the Bar association here in entertaining them.

The matter was upon motion placed on file for future consideration

Moved and seconded that the Superintendent of Water Works and Sewers Rent the office offered by Messers Bros. for \$5.00 per month A vote was then taken on the above motion which was as follows Barton voted yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

Moved and seconded that the Bond of Lee H. Burnell as Policeman be accepted and placed on file Carried

A communication from P. S. Romney was received asking the Council to appoint him a Special Merchant Police at a salary of \$30 per month

The matter of appointing a special police was upon motion referred to the Fire and Police. Carried

The following persons bid upon the operating of the Street Car line for the year 1901. J. A. Ager, John M Price, M. A. Gifford and Henry Gubbs. The matter of letting the Street Car for a year was referred to the Street and Alley Committee upon motion duly seconded and carried.

Upon motion duly seconded. A warrant was ordered drawn on the Gen fund for \$10⁰⁰ for Barn Rent for Street Car. for April and May in favor of J W Harris. A vote was then taken which was as follows. Barton voted yea, Harbo yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Mantley yea, Show yea, Waldroup yea. Carried

Moved and seconded That the tapping machines be left with the Superintendent of the Water Works. Each Plumber to look after his own work. The Superintendent to set a time for the plumber to use the tapping machine when he has a tap to make and return ^{the machine} immediately to the Superintendent as soon as the work is finished. Carried

Moved and seconded That a warrant be drawn on the Water fund for \$11⁵⁰ for interest on supply from the Jameville Iron Works Co. in favor of the Jameville Iron Works Co. A vote was then taken which was as follows. Barton voted yea Harbo yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Mantley yea, Show yea Waldroup yea. Carried.

Upon motion All new bills were referred to the Finance Committee.

Moved and seconded That the purchasing committee ^{purchase} one hundred and twenty five inches of Water for the season of 1901. A vote was then taken which was as follows. Barton voted yea Harbo yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea Mantley yea, Show yea, Waldroup yea. Carried.

Moved and seconded That the Street Commissioner set out Scarolina ^{populare} ^{in the parks} in the places of the dead trees and also protect the young trees with board spring. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Council receive bids for the construction of a jawd stave, both sets of plans to be submitted for the contractor to bid. Plans to be in the hands of the City Clerk. Carried

The City Attorney reported on the bill of Platt Rogers for \$300⁰⁰ for legal services as per Contract of former date. See Page 432 Vol. 1. Record.

Moved and seconded That a warrant be drawn on the water fund in favor of Rogers & Shafroth.

for \$50⁰⁰ for ^{bal due} services in the Hydrant rental case in the Court of Appeals. A vote was then taken which was as follows: Barton voted yea, Hards yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Manty yea, Shore yea, Waldroup yea. Carried. Bill 106.

Moved and seconded That J. W. Billing be allowed to address the Council upon the Reservoir. Carried.

Moved and seconded That the City Engineer be instructed to estimate the cost of repairing the old reservoir and also the cost of building a new reservoir 60 x 60 x 6 in solid earth. Carried.

Moved and seconded That the Superintendent of Sewers receive bids for plumbing and connecting the City Hall and Jail with the sewer system and that he also have power to act. A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows: Barton voted yea, Hards yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Manty yea, Shore yea, Waldroup yea. Carried.

Moved and seconded That S. Rimmick be allowed to address the council on the matter of weighing coal for the pump house on the city scales. Carried.

Moved and seconded We adjourn until Monday night the sixth day of May. A.D. 1901. Carried.
