May 14 1901

Regular meeting of the City Council Mayor  
Sampliner in the Chair Upon Roll Call the  
following Aldermen responded Barton, Hards,  
Hutchinson, Lee, Manty, Shaw, and Waldroup. Absent  
Lickerson

Minutes of previous meeting read and  
Approved with Corrections.

The Petition of Briscoll, Rogers and  
others for an extension of water mains to Carpenters  
sub division was upon motion referred to the  
water Committee.

The Petition of Hill Roberts and others  
for an extension of the City Water mains into Cannon  
sub division was upon motion referred to the water  
Committee.

The monthly report of the Supt of  
Water works was received and upon motion  
referred to the Water Committee.

The monthly reports of Police Mag.  
City Weigher and Treasurer were upon motion  
referred to the Finance Committee.

A deed for the Right of way for water  
works pipe line across certain land having been  
tendered to the City by A. E. Gourley for a consider-  
ation of \$450 it was on motion duly seconded  
ordered that said deed be accepted and placed  
on record and that a warrant be drawn on  
the water fund for the sum of \$450 <sup>for</sup> A. E. Gourley  
and that he be furnished water for the Cemetery  
at 10¢ per 1,000 gal meter rate a vote was then  
taken which was as follows Barton voted yea

Hards yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Mantley yea,  
Shore yea, Waldroup yea. Carried

The communication from Henry Grubb referring  
to the express men license was referred to the license  
committee upon motion to investigate

A communication was received from Charles  
W. Haskell appointing J. W. Parmenter, as his deputy  
city engineer. That matter was upon motion referred  
to the Mayor.

The petition for a new sidewalk signed  
by J. B. Hutchinson, Porter and others was reported on  
unfavorable on account of there being only one house  
in Block 113

The Petition of Gates, Arnett, and others in  
Mopley Addition for water was upon motion granted  
the parties to dig trenches and refill the same the  
city to furnish the pipe.

The communication of M. Beiser asking for  
an extension of water mains to his residence in  
Mopley addition was upon motion laid on the  
table until some future meeting

Moved and seconded That the street car  
be leased to John M. Price until April 1 1902 at  
\$5.00 per month in advance, and that the city attorney  
draw up lease and the same be properly signed  
by the Mayor and clerk. A vote was then taken  
on the foregoing motion which was as follows Barton  
voted yea, Hards yea, Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Mantley yea,  
Shore yea, Waldroup yea. Carried

The Chairman of the Fire and Police  
Committee reported unfavorable to the hiring of O. S.  
Ramsey as a merchant. The committee report was  
upon motion excepted and ordered placed on file

The Fire and Police Committee recommended  
the purchase of new running gears for the fire wagon,  
the trimming down of the ladder, the erection of  
a small house for the use of the hose cart somewhere  
in Crawford's addition and the placing of the  
hose cart therein, and the patching of the floor in  
the main Hall. The report of the committee was  
accepted and upon motion duly seconded the  
committee was given power to act by the following  
vote Barton voted yea, Hards yea, Hutchinson  
yea, Lee yea, Mantley yea, Shore yea, Waldroup yea.  
Carried

Moved and seconded That the report of the  
Pest House Committee on not purchasing clothes  
for patients be accepted. Carried

An invitation was received from  
Mayor Napier and Board of Trustees of Glenwood Spgs.  
Inviting the city council to be present in Glenwood

on Presidential Day June 4<sup>th</sup> 1901  
 Upon motion duly seconded the invitation was accepted

The Bids on the erection of a Grand Staircase were opened, W.E. Grady was the lowest bidder his bid being \$208<sup>00</sup>

Moved and seconded That the Purchasing Committee have power to act in the building of a Grand Staircase. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Harde yea Hutcherson yea Lee nay Manty yea Shores yea Waldrough yea Carried

Moved and seconded That a plumbers License be granted A.M. Bucklin and his Bond be approved Carried

Moved and seconded That J. W. Crawford be allowed to address the Council upon the furnishing of Brick for the reservoir Carried

Moved and seconded That the matter of Brick be referred to the Water Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Street Commissioner take up the switch in front of the Brunswick Hotel Carried

Moved and seconded that the matter of fencing in the two lots on the corner of Col. Ave. and Sixth Street be referred to the Street and Alley Committee with power to act. A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows: Bartons voted yea Harde yea, Hutchinson yea Lee yea, Mantley yea, Shoro yea, Waldroup yea Carried

Moved and seconded That the matter of a Street Car Barn be referred to the Street and Alley Committee to investigate Carried

The following resolution was then introduced

Madam:

At a meeting of the City Council held April 13 1901, The Street Supervisor's certificate was received for the construction of side walk along and in front of the following described property.

Commencing at a point  $334\frac{1}{2}$  feet W. of a point  $324\frac{1}{2}$  feet N. of the S.E. cor. NW  $\frac{1}{4}$ , SE  $\frac{1}{4}$ , Sec 15 Township 1 South Range 1 West 10th Meridian. Then a West 50 feet, North  $157\frac{1}{2}$  feet, East 50 feet, South  $157\frac{1}{2}$  feet to the place of beginning.

There is standing against the said property the amount of \$17.77 for the construction of said side walk.

There was also a resolution passed assessing said amount \$17.77 against said described property.

Tuesday May 14 1901 at 8 P.M. at the Council Chamber was the day set for the hearing of any objections as to the justness and correctness of the above amount so assessed and you may appear before the Council on the above named date and be heard upon the matter.

Be it resolved That the said side walk assessment here to for and on the 12 day of April 1901 made against the said described tract of land be and the same is hereby confirmed and the City Clerk is hereby instructed to certify said assessment to the County Officer now having the custody of the tax list to be by him placed there on and collected as other taxes with 10% penalty provided the same be not paid to said City Clerk on or before the 29 day of May 1901. Moved and seconded That Geo Gates be allowed to address the Council upon the detention of water mains in Nobles addition. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Purchasing Committee take up the matter of sewer receipts for the County Treasurer and have the same printed at once. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea Show yea Waldroup yea

Moved and seconded That the matter of changing the course of the Farmers ditch on North Street be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded That the City Marshal have all garbage dumped into the Grand River until further notice. Carried

Moved and seconded That the matter of building a shoot from the bluff on the south side of the Grand River to throw garbage and other refuse into so it will go into the river be referred to the Street and Alley Committee to investigate. Carried

Moved and seconded We adjourn until next regular meeting Tuesday evening June 11 at 8 P.M. 1901. Carried.
