

Grand Junction Colo.  
June 11, 1901

Regular meeting of the City Council, Mayor  
Sampliner on the Chair

Upon Roll Call the following Aldermen responded  
Barton, Dickerson, Harde, Hutchinson, Lee, Mantey Shores  
and Waldroup.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

A Petition was received asking for the  
regulation of the Street Car so that it will not be run in the  
interest of two Hotels but the public in general, signed by  
W.T. Dourdy and forty ex others.

The matter was upon motion duly seconded  
referred to the City Attorney.

The monthly reports of the City Treasurer and  
Police Magistrate were received and read and upon  
motion referred to the Finance Com.

Moved and seconded that the report of Water Works  
report be referred to the Water Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded that the Recommendations of  
the Fire Department of Sydenham as driver be re-  
ferred to the Fire & Police Committee with power  
to act and report at next meeting of the Council  
Carried

The Water Committee made the following  
report on the extension of the water main into Carbon  
Sub Division

We the City Water Works Committee do hereby  
report on the extension of Water Main

If the water consumers on said line of  
Pipe will pay fifty per cent of <sup>first</sup> cost of said water  
mains in advance said amount to be deducted out of  
water rentals of said consumers. the Committee would  
then recommend that the City extend a 4 inch water  
main to the City Limits below the Flowering Mill.

The Committee's report was upon motion  
accepted and placed on file.

The Water Committee made the following  
report on the extension of water mains to Bearpenter's  
Sub division

We the undersigned Committee do hereby  
report on the within water extension follows:

If the water consumers on said line of  
pipe will pay fifty per cent of first cost of water  
mains in advance said amount to be deducted  
out of water rentals of said consumers, the Committee  
would then recommend that City extend a 4 in water  
main from Spruce on White to the Fruita Road a distance  
of 1300 feet.

Moved and Seconded that the report of the Water Committee on the extension of water mains to Carpenter's Sub Division be accepted and placed on file. Carried

The Communication and Recommendations of the Superintendent of Water Works on a new meter rate was upon motion referred to the Water Committee to report on at next meeting of the City Council.

Moved and Seconded That W. J. Connelly, J. N. Bunting and Frank Rubering be allowed to address the Council on the meter rate for water for motor and laundry purposes. Carried

Moved and Seconded That the matter of revenues for the Library be laid over until next meeting of the Council. Carried

Amendment offered by Dickerson and seconded by Lee that a committee of three be appointed to investigate the library finances and recommend the best way they see fit to handle the funds. Carried

The Mayor appointed on the Committee to investigate the library matter Dickerson, Harbo and Lee.

Moved and Seconded That the Mayor and two Aldermen be appointed as a committee to examine into the safety of the Brunswick Hotel, and Lebas' Wharf Laundry, near the Progress Bakery, and that they have power to call in such assistance as they see fit. Carried. President of the Council Dickerson, appointed Mayor, Kaufman, Alderman Shores and Hutchinson on the Committee.

Moved and Seconded That Plumbers Licenses be granted Garrison & Fletch, and P. A. Whistler and their bonds be approved. Carried

Moved and Seconded That the matter of the purchase of iron seats for the park be referred to the Purchasing Committee. Carried

Alderman Barton was then excused from Council

All new bills were upon motion referred to the Finance Committee

Moved and Seconded that the rules be suspended by unanimous consent and we take up Ordinance No 103. Carried

Moved and Seconded That we adopt ordinance No 103 as read. Ordinance 103 being "An Ordinance Concerning Bicycles" A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

The following Resolution was then

Introduced.

Be it resolved that bicycles racks be allowed to be placed on the side walks of this city; provided that the same shall not be more than three feet in height, nor more than thirty inches wide and shall not extend more than three feet from the out edge of any side walk, nor shall the same be used for the display of signs or any advertising purpose. Upon motion duly seconded that the above resolution be adopted. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Street and Alley Committee have power to act in making such provisions as they see necessary for the completion of the Barn and the placing of water in the Corral. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantley yea Shores yea Waldrough yea Carried

Moved and seconded That the Street Commissioner drain Slough in Nobles addition providing the cost of same does not exceed \$5.00. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantley yea Shores yea Waldrough yea Carried

Moved and seconded That the City Attorney prepare new ordinances on show licenses and report next meeting. Carried

Moved and seconded That the matter of a new collar for the fire harness be referred to the Fire and Police Com. with power to act. A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantley yea Shores yea Waldrough yea Carried

Moved and seconded We adjourn until Tuesday night June 18 at 8 P.M. 1901 Carried
