Adjourned meeting of the City Council
Mayor Sampliner in the chair Upon Roll call

Moved and seconded that we accept the
gift of The Woman's Library Association of Books
and furniture for the new library and that we

Moved and seconded the Petition of Hagner

Grand River Sub Division be referred to the water Committee with power to act. A vote was then taken which was as follows Dickerson voted yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea, Lee yea Waldrough yea Jost.

Moved and seconded the Petition of Hagner be referred to the water Committee Carried.

Alderman Shors entered council here.

The Petition Sampliner and Crosby for the extension of a 4 in water main up seventh street was upon motion duly seconded referred to the water Committee.

A Petition was received signed by W J Fall and others asking the Council to have the Western Union Telegraph Wires and poles removed from the street as the same interfered with the trees, which were clipped every year, so as not to interfere with the wires. The matter was upon motion referred to the Street and Alley Committee.

The Recommendations and report of the Fire Department were upon motion referred to the Fire and Police Committee.

Moved and seconded That Henry Nichol and Sam M^r Mary be allowed to address the Council upon the matter of a flat water rate for the Sugar Co. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the recommendations of the Superintendent of the Water Works on a new water rate be laid over until next meeting of the Council. Carried.

Moved and seconded We allow the bill of A. N. Bucklin for 27²⁵ on the water fund and the Clerk draw warrant for the same. A vote was then taken which was as follows Dickerson voted yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea, Lee yea Shors yea Waldrough yea Carried.

The Committee consisting of the Mayor and two Aldermen, ^{Hutchinson & Shors} appointed to investigate into the safety of the Brunswick Hotel, reported the building to be unsafe and that of Chas Whas Laundry as safe.

Upon motion duly seconded the report was accepted and the Marshal was instructed to notify the property owners and agents that the Building known as the Brunswick on lots 18, 19nd 20 in Block 102, be declared a nuisance and the Marshal was further instructed to serve the notice so ordered by ordinance in such cases made and provided. A vote was then taken of the foregoing motion which was as follows Dickerson voted yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Shors

Moved and seconded That Otto Splatstauer and Wm Jones be allowed to address the Council upon the matter of the Turner Festival June 22, 23 and 24. Carried
