July 9, 1901

Regular meeting of the City Council Mayor
Samplers in the chair. Whom Roll Call The following
Aldermen responded Barton Dickerson Hards Hutchinson
Lee and Manley. Absent Shores & Waldrup.

Minutes of June 18 June 25 June 27 read and
approved.

Moved and Seconded That Capt Lemmon
be allowed to address the Council upon the matter
of connecting the Indian School Sewer with the
City Sewer System. Carried

Moved and Seconded That the Indian
School be permitted to connect with the City's sewer
system anywhere in the alley south of South Street where
it is feasible at a rate of \$150.00 per annum, the
City reserving the right for its inhabitants to con-
nect any where along said line. Carried.

Moved and Seconded That Chas Jenkins be
allowed to address the Council on the extension of a
two inch water main on South Street to the Electric
light plant. Carried

Indian School
Sewer

The matter of water for the electric light plant was upon motion referred to the water committee to report on next meeting of the Council

Moved and Seconded That we suspend the regular order of business and take up Ordinance No 105 by unanimous consent. A vote was taken which was as follows Barton voted yea, Dickerson yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantley yea Carried

Moved and Seconded That the Proposed Ordinance No 105 which was duly read in full be placed upon its passage Ordinance No 105 being an Ordinance entitled, "A Bill for Ordinance No 105. An ordinance to authorize the Grand Valley Gas and Oil Company (a corporation) to operate Gas and Oil pipe lines within the corporate limits of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and to sell and deliver Gas, oil and kindred substances for illuminating, heating, power and general commercial uses to consumers thereof in said City, and for such purposes to own and control wells and refineries, and to own, lay and repair pipes ^{lines} in and through the streets and alleys thereof." A vote was then taken upon the passage of the above ordinance which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Hards yea Hutchinson nay Lee nay Mantley nay. The result being a tie vote Mayor Sampson's name was called and he voted nay. Motion was Lost.

Moved and Seconded That the application and Bond of Prescott West for a plumber license be referred to the license Committee. Carried

The Monthly reports of the Superintendent of Water Works, City Weigher, Police Magistrate and City Treasurer were upon motion referred to the proper Committees.

Moved and Seconded That John Price be heard on the entention of the street Car line to the Grand Hotel Carried

Moved and Seconded That the matter of extending the street Car line to the Grand Hotel be referred to the street and alley Committee Carried

Moved and Seconded That the Mayor appoint a Committee of two to investigate the reservoir at Salt Lake City and secure such data as possible. A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantley yea Carried

The Mayor appointed Aldermen Barton and Mantley as the Committee to visit the reservoir at Salt Lake City.

Moved and Seconded That the report of the Street and Alley Committee on the removal of the Western Union Telegraph Company poles to the alleys be accepted and that they be notified to remove

at once The equal part of the removal of the Telegraph pole was referred to the City Attorney carried

Moved and seconded That H. Hagner be allowed to connect with the water mains in Grand River Sub Division and that he be given credit on his water rental for the cost of the pipe carried

The Petition of Sampson and Crosby for an extension of a 4 in main up seventh street was denied

Moved and seconded A warrant be drawn for \$75⁰⁰ in favor of J. B. Dickerson as janitor for the month of June. A vote was then taken which was as follows. Barton voted yea Dickerson excused from voting Harbo yea, Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea. Carried

Plans were submitted by J. J. Lumsden for the remodeling of the City Hall which were upon motion referred to the First Police Committee

A Communication was received from Mrs D. H. Killen asking the city to allow her \$50⁰⁰ for the injury sustained to a foot caused by a loose board on the sidewalk. The matter was upon motion referred to the City Attorney to investigate

Moved by Mantey and seconded by Lee That we reconsider the motion and vote on Ordinance No 105 and the same be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows. Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Bill for Arc lights for the First Quarter in 1901 be cut in two. Carried

The Express and Job license of A. C. Fletcher was upon motion duly seconded transferred to The N. G. Bedwell Co.

All new bills were upon motion referred to the Finance Committee.

The matter of water for settling sewers was upon motion referred to the Water Committee

Moved and seconded That the matter of a new sidewalk along the north side of Block 134 be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Woodmen of the World be given the use of the park Aug. 9 1901 for their celebration. Carried

The matter of a new fire plug at the state bridge for fire protection was upon motion referred to the Water Committee to confer with the County Commissioners to see if they will bear half of the expense of the same

Moved and seconded That the necessary repairs be made on the water box over the bridge, which was caused by the last fire. Carried

Moved and seconded That the Street and Alley Committee investigate the Cost of Delta Cement for Street Crossing from Meserve. Carried

Moved & seconded We adjourn until Tuesday night at 8 P.M. July. 16. 1901 Carried
