Regular meeting of the City Council  
Mayor Sarsfield in the chair Upon Roll call  
the following Aldermen responded Barton, Dick-  
erson, Hards, Hutchinson, Lee, Shore, and Waldroup  
absent Mantey

Minutes of previous meeting read and  
approved.

The Petition of Van Horn and others for  
a light near James Hynes in Crawford's addition



was upon motion referred to the water and light Committee

The monthly report of the Treasurer, City weights and Police magistrate were received and read. Upon motion duly seconded the reports were referred to the Finance Committee

The Superintendent of water works report was upon motion referred to the water committee

The Light and Water Committee recommended an arc lamp at the crossing on 7th street near the Fruit growers association

Moved and seconded That the report of the Light be rejected Carried

The Street and Alley Committee recommended a new side walk be laid on the east side of eleventh street between Grand and White and along the south side of Grand Ave from eleventh st to Twelfth

The following resolution was then introduced

Whereas in the opinion of a two thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new side walk be constructed along and in front of lots 1 to 17 inclusive on the north side of Block 88 in the City of Grand Junction and on the south side of Grand Ave also along the west side of Lots 34 and 41 in Block 88 and on the east side of Eleventh Street in the City of Grand Junction Colo.

Therefore be it ordered that a new side walk be constructed such as provided by ordinance, save that it be six feet wide instead of 12, along and in front of the above described property or lots under the provisions of the statutes and ordinance in such cases made and provided.

A vote was then taken on the foregoing resolution which was as follows Barton voted yea, Hickerson yea, Harde, yea, Hutcheson yea, Lee, yea, Shores, yea Waldroup yea, Carried.

The Street and Alley committee also recommended a new side walk along certain parts of Seventh Street.

Moved and seconded that the recommendations of the Street and Alley committee be accepted and a new side walk ordered. Carried

The following resolution was then introduced.

Whereas in the opinion of a two thirds majority of the City Council, it is necessary that a new side walk be constructed on the West side of 7th Street along and in front of lots 11 to 16 inclusive in Block 138 also along and in front of lots 16 to 20 inclusive in Block 149, and also along and in front of lots 11 to 15 inclusive block 140. also along and in front of two



tracts of land on lower 7th street one of  $\frac{40}{100}$  of an acre and the other of  $1\frac{3}{100}$  of an acre thence to the right of way of the Dep. R. R. line

Therefore be it ordered that a new side walk be constructed such as provided by ordinance save that it be six feet wide instead of 12, along and in front of the above described property or lots under the provisions of the statute and ordinance in such cases made and provided. A vote was then taken on the foregoing resolution which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea, Hards, yea, Hutchinson yea Lee yea, Shores, yea Waldron, yea, Carried

The Water Committee recommended that the City lay 200 feet of 3" in pipe to his residence in Moberly addition the City to pay 50% and He. to pay 50% under the former regulation on laying pipe.

Moved and seconded that the recommendations of the water committee be accepted and that the work be done under the supervision of the Superintendent of the Water Work. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea, Hards, yea, Hutchinson yea Lee yea Shores yea, Waldron yea, Carried.

The Water Committee recommended that the City bear 100% of the expense of laying 345 feet of 3 in water pipe on First West Street in Grand River sub division, other residents in that section to pay the rest of the cost of laying the pipe.

Moved and seconded that the report and recommendations of the Water Committee be accepted and the work be done under the supervision of the Supt. of Water Works. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea, Hards, yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Shores yea Waldron yea Carried

All new bills were upon motion referred to the Finance Committee.

All Library bills were upon motion referred to the Finance Committee.

The Water Committee recommended that a warrant for \$100 be drawn in favor of J. A. K. Crawford in settlement for a contract for some thousands brick which could not be used.

Moved and seconded that the report of the Committee be accepted and that a warrant for \$100 be drawn on the water fund for the same in favor of J. A. K. Crawford. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried.

The following resolution was then introduced by Alderman Lee who moved its adoption

Whereas since the date of the passage of the annual appropriation ordinance during the last quarter of the preceding fiscal year; certain casualties and accidents have happened, the prevalence of small-pox requiring the erection and maintenance of a hospital or pest house and the care of small pox patients which said improvements were duly and regularly ordered pursuant to law by a vote of more than two thirds of the members of the City Council; And whereas warrants have been drawn upon the general fund in payment for said improvements in the total sum of \$2013.73,

Therefore be it resolved, That the Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby authorized, should the necessity arise to draw sign and issue warrants upon said general fund to an amount not exceeding said sum of \$2013.73 in excess of the amount provided for said fund in said annual appropriation ordinance in payment of any bills lawfully allowed against said fund by the City Council. A vote was then taken on the foregoing resolution which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Harbo yea Hutchinson yea, Lee yea, Shores yea, Waldroup yea Carried.
