Minutes of previous meeting read and  
approved

A Petition was received signed by sixty eight  
people asking for two lights on Seventh Street, one  
at the corner of 7th + South and the other at the  
Rail Road crossing

Moved and seconded That D. Roberts  
be allowed to address the Council on the matter  
of lights on South 7th Street carried

The Petition for lights on South 7th Street  
was upon motion referred to the Light Committee

The Petition of Gail C. Murry asking for  
the change in location of his Saloon was  
referred to the License Committee

The monthly report of The Treasurer Police  
Magistrate & City Weights were referred to the  
Finance Committee

The monthly report of the Supt of W.W.  
was referred to the Water Committee

The Water Works Committee asked the  
Council for one more week's time to prepare its final  
report and recommendations on the reservoir

The request of the Water Committee was  
upon motion granted.

Moved and seconded That we transfer

\$6000 from the General fund to the Street and Alley fund. A vote was then taken which was as follows:

Moved and Seconded That Ordinance No 106 be adopted as read. Ordinance No 106 <sup>entitled</sup> "An Ordinance Concerning Licenses". A vote was then taken on the adoption of the foregoing ordinance which was as follows Barton voted yeas Dickerson yeas Hards yeas Hutchinson yeas Lee yeas Mantey yeas Thores yeas Waldrough yeas Carried.

Moved and Seconded That the City Attorney draw up a contract with S Remmel for hauling coal to the pump house for the ensuing year Carried.

Moved and Seconded That the Supt of Water Works be instructed to have the ordinance rigidly enforced on back filling all trenches in the streets and alleys Carried.

Moved and Seconded be adjourned until Tuesday night Sept 17 - 1901 at 8 PM Carried.
