Regular meeting of the City Council  
Mayor Sampson in the Chair Whom Roll  
Call the following Aldermen responded  
Barton Dickerson Hards Hutchinson Mantey  
Shores and Waldrough Absent Alderman Lee

Minutes of previous meeting read and  
approved

A petition was signed by Wm Lee  
and others asking for a new side walk.  
the matter was upon motion duly seconded  
referred to the Street & Alley Committee

The Petition of W. R. Wadsworth and  
others asking the Council to do something  
with the ditch and dumping grounds  
on North Avenue was received and read  
and upon motion duly seconded  
referred to the Street and Alley Committee

A Petition was received signed  
by G. B. Hutchinson and others asking  
the Council to extend the water from 8th  
Street on Colorado Ave to 10th Street The  
matter was referred to the Water and Sewer  
Committee to investigate.

The Protest of the D. & R. G. R. Co  
against issuing Sam Gleason a saloon  
license in Block 144 was received and

read and upon motion duly seconded placed on file

The monthly reports of the City Treasurer, City Watch, Police Magistrate and Quarterly report of the Fire Department were received

read and referred to the Finance Committee  
The Supt. of Water Works report was received and referred to the Water Committee

The monthly reports of the Supt of Water Work for the months of Nov. and Dec. were found correct and ordered placed on file

The following resolution was then introduced

Whereas In the opinion of a two thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new side walk be constructed on the West side of Seventh along and in front of Lots (11) Eleven (12) Twelve and (13) Thirteen in Block 611 Sixty one of the City of Grand Junction Colorado.

Therefore be it ordered That a new side walk be constructed as provided by ordinance save that it be six feet wide instead of Twelve along and in front of the above described property under the provisions of the statute and Ordinance in such cases made and provided  
The vote was then taken which was as follows

The License Committee recommended the application of Sam Gleason for a saloon license in Block 144. be not granted.

Moved and seconded that the report of the License Committee be accepted and application of Sam Gleason be rejected  
Carried

Moved and seconded That the City Clerk notify a. a. Burke of the conditions of connecting with the sewer system with that property laying out side the districts  
Carried

The application of Balawd Thornton for the Position of Sewer and Plumber Inspector was received and placed on file

The Street and Alley Committee asked for more time in which to make

its report in membership house laying in the different addition to the City. The time was upon motion granted the Committee

W. W. Arnett was given the privilege of addressing the City Council upon motion regarding the River Banks across the Pump House which he claimed were endangered by the new wing being placed in the river

Moved and seconded that the matter of a dike in the River at the pump house and the Banks of Lee Arnett's land be referred to the Water Committee and the City Attorney Carried

The matter of selling lumber to C. W. Arnett from the Pump house was referred to the Water committee with power to act.

Chief of the Fire Department G. P. Rogers was allowed to address the Council upon the matter of the purchase of a new fire wagon and other paraphanelia for the fire Department

The matter of a new fire wagon and other equipments was upon motion referred to the Fire & Police Committee.

Moved and seconded That the Council allow Lee Purnell \$500 on his bill for \$1150 damages. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Hardey yea Hutchinson yea Mauley yea Shore yea Waldroup yea Carried
