The Petition of Rust Brothers and  
others for the extension of the water mains  
on South street from 8<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> was read  
and upon motion duly seconded referred  
to the Water Committee.

The Petition of Walter Eugh  
and others for a new side walk on the  
South side of Block 75 was received, read  
and upon motion referred to the Street  
and Alley Committee.

The Recommendations of N. V.  
Foster and the application of W. T. Clark and  
Recommendations were received and read  
and upon motion placed on file for  
future reference.

The Communication of Park  
Davis Leo. regarding a disinfecting  
Lamp was upon motion placed  
on file for future reference.

Two Communications were  
received from Supt Semow of Teller  
Institute regarding the Indian School  
sewer. which were read and ordered  
placed on file.

Moved and Seconded That  
Supt Semow. of Teller institute be allow-  
ed to address the council upon the matter  
of a Right of way through the Southern  
part of the City for a sewer system  
from Teller Institute. Carried

Moved and Seconded That the  
United States Government. be granted the  
Right of Way to extend and lay its sewer  
system and pipe from the Teller Institute  
near Grand Junction through, along and  
across the streets Alley and Avenues of this  
City from the point where it enters said  
City on the eastern boundary. to and extend  
into the Grand River at a point  
below South of the D. & G. Rail Road Co.  
Round House. A vote was then taken

Moved and seconded That Julius Rearse be allowed to address the Council upon the matter of the Purchase of a Fire Wagon. Carried

The application of P. J. Cuff for a building permit was received and upon motion referred to the Fire & Police Committee

Moved and seconded That the matter of purchasing a fire wagon along with all the data be referred to the Purchasing Committee and the Chairman of the Finance Committee to make a report at next meeting of the Council. Carried

Moved and seconded That the bill of Miss Lena Perry for nursing Relative during quarantine for Small pox be referred back to the lady. Carried

The matter of allowing Mrs Jackson to connect her premises on First Street with the sewer was upon motion referred to the Sup. of Water Works.

The Committee on the extension of the fire limits asked for more time in which to make their report. More time was granted the Committee upon motion

Moved and seconded That B. W. Deolder be allowed to employ an assistant pumpman at a salary of \$5.00 a month until the reservoir is completed. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantley yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

The Water Committee Recommended that G. R. Barton be allowed a salary of \$25.00 per month during the construction of the Reservoir
