Moved and seconded That the Purchasing Committee secure a new fire horse to mate the black and then use Dick and Button as a street team. A vote was then taken which was as follows Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea Shores yea Waldroup yea. Carried

The following resolution was then introduced

Whereas in and by the Contract heretofore awarded for the construction of the improvements in sanitary sewer districts nos One and Two of the City of Grand Junction Colorado, It is provided that payment for said sewer improvements shall be made to the contractor in public improvement bonds or warrants of said City drawn upon the funds of said districts in monthly installments of ninety percent of all money due for work done during the preceding month under and in accordance with the provisions and stipulations of said Contract based upon monthly estimates of the work completed and certified to by the Engineer and approved by the City Council and

Whereas the remaining 10% of said contract price was due on the first day of Dec. A.D. 1900, and

Whereas on account of the deferred payments, the remaining \$1,398<sup>00</sup> in bonds were not to be issued until after April 1, 1901 and

not until such time thereafter until said Contractor shall have properly settled the trenches and leveled the alley in accordance with the terms of said Contract and

Whereas The Contractor has at this time properly refilled and leveled the trenches of the sewer system in accordance with the contract and

Whereas The Contractor has delivered to the City Clerk a certified check for \$100<sup>00</sup> and reimbursed the City to the amount of \$70<sup>56</sup> money expended on sewers. Therefore

Be it Resolved That the following described bonds be delivered to the Contractor Namely

Sewer District No 1

Bonds Numbers 7 to 10 both Inclusive  
(4 bonds) for the sum of \$100<sup>00</sup> each \$400<sup>00</sup>

Sewer District No 2

Bonds Numbers 26<sup>th</sup> and 27 both Inclusive  
(2 Bonds) for the sum of \$500<sup>00</sup> each \$1,000<sup>00</sup>

Total Bonds in two Districts \$1,400<sup>00</sup>

Total (6 Bonds)

For which when issued the Contractor shall give the Treasurer a good and sufficient receipt. A vote was then taken on the foregoing motion which was as follows. Barton voted yea Dickerson yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Lee yea Mantey yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried
