Regular meeting of the City Council
Mayor Sampliner in the chair Upon Roll
Call the following Aldermen responded
Barton Brumback Hards Hutchinson Maundy
McBary and Shoes Absent Waldroup

Minutes of previous meeting
read and approved.

The monthly reports of the City
Treasurer, City Weigher and Police Magistrate
were read and referred to the Finance
Committee

The monthly report of the Supt.
of Water Works was read and upon motion
referred to the Water Committee

The matter of numbering
houses in the subdivision and additions
to the City and the resurvey of the same

was referred to the Street and Alley Committee
 The Committee appointed to investigate
 into the safety of the Old Platt livery barn
 asked for more time in which to report
 on the condition of the Brick part but
 recommended that the marshal serve a
 notice on the owners of the rear part. (The frame
 building) to tear the same down at once.

Moved and seconded That the
 report of the Committee be accepted and
 that the Marshal notify owners of said
 property to tear said building down and
 remove the same. Carried

Moved and seconded that the
 Purchasing Committee be given more time
 in which to report on the purchase of a
 fire wagon and the same have power
 to act on the purchase of a wagon

A vote was then taken which was as

 McCarry yea Shous yea. Carried

The License Committee reported
 favorable upon the application and bond
 of Whistler and Trobity for a plumbers license

Moved and seconded that the application
 of Whistler and Trobity be granted and the bond
 approved. Carried

A communication was received
 from a number of expressmen protesting
 against certain expressmen running more
 wagons than they paid license on.

The communication was upon motion
 referred to the License Committee.

Moved and seconded That the
 application of Quinc Dutton for a plumbing
 license be granted and his bond be approved
 Carried

Moved and seconded That J. C. Dick
 erson be allowed to address the council upon
 the condition of the bedding in the City Jail
 Carried

Moved and seconded That the Jan-
 itor have the blankets in the Jail washed
 A vote was then taken which was as
 follows. Barton voted yea Brummick yea
 Hards yea Hutchinson yea Mantey yea McCarry
 yea Shous yea. Carried

Moved and seconded That the
 Fire Department be allowed to collect \$20
 from the sale of hose to W. T. Clark and

spent the same towards the fixing up of the
fire department room. A vote was then taken
which was as follows Barton voted yea Brunius
yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Mantz yea McCary
yea Shores yea. Carried

Moved and seconded that the above bills be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the same. A vote was then taken which was as follows: Barton voted yea, Brummick yea, Hards yea, Hutchinson yea, Manty yea, M. Cary yea, Snow yea, Carried.

The Bills of Raughman & Anderson were upon motion referred to the City Attorney.

A Proposed Ordinance No 110 was then introduced and read and upon motion duly seconded ordered published according to law. J. M. C. Martin to pay the expense of publication.

The City Attorney was instructed to prepare an ordinance requiring all property owners after the date of the passage of the ordinance to construct side walks between third and ~~fourth~~ street on main of stone flagging or concrete.

The Committee upon the reorganization of the Fire Department made the following Report.

We recommend of the ^{hiring of} three paid men a chief at a salary of 50 dollars per month and 20

per month a jailor and two men at a salary
\$45 per month each we also recomened the retaining
of 5 volunteers and that they receive the sum of
50¢ per hour for each call or fraction thereof we
also recomend J. C. Kiepersom as Chief and J. L. Dyer,
Ed. Limes and Tom Handell as assistants.

Moved and seconded that the report
be accepted and that the City Attorney draw
an ordinance to comply with the recomendations
of the Committee. Carried

The matter of securing a plat of the
water works system was refered to the Water Com.
to investigate.

Moved and seconded that the Purchas-
ing committee have power to place a weir in
the irrigating at the head gate at a cost of \$1000
A vote was then taken which was as follows
Barton voted yea Brumick yea Hards yea
Kutelinson yea Mantey yea Mc-Cary yea Shores
yea Carried

Moved and seconded that Geo. R. Barton
have the pipe leading from the Pumphouse to
the reservoir covered and packed so as to prevent
freezing. Carried

Geo. R. Barton then submitted his
report of the Construction of the City Reservoir
which was read and upon motion tendered
to the news papers for publication and then
ordered placed on file.

Moved and seconded that the Citizens
Band be employed to furnish music in the
park the coming season for the sum of \$150
A vote was then taken which was as follows
Barton voted nay Brumick no Hards yea Kutelin-
son yea Mantey nay Mc-Cary nay Shores yea
Lost

Moved and seconded that the matter
of purchasing a fire hose be refered to the
purchasing Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded that J. W. Bellinger
be heard upon the matter of veteran fireman
Certificates. Carried

Moved and seconded we adjourn
until next regular meeting the 10th day of
June. A. D. 1903 Carried
