Regular meeting of the City Council
Mayor Sampson in the chair Upon Roll Call
the following Aldermen responded Brunick
Hards Mantey Mrs Cary Shors and Waldroup.
Barton and Hutchinson absent.

Minutes of June 10 and 24 read and
approved.

A number of petitions signed by the
Pastors and officers of the the Young people
societies of the different churches was received
asking the Council to pass an ordinance
requiring all places of business and amusement
except Hotels, Restaurants, and Drug stores to close
on Sunday

The Petitions of the above were
upon motion referred to the City Attorney
to draft an ordinance covering the same if
found not in conflict with other laws.

A Petition for a new sidewalk
was received asking that the same be laid along
the east side of Block No 105 of the City. signed
by A.R. Sampson and others.

Moved and seconded the above petition
be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded That the appointment
of Nell Howell as a fireman be confirmed. A
vote was taken upon the confirming of Nell Howell
as a fireman which was as follows Brunick
votes yea. Hards yea. Mantey yea Mrs Cary yea
Shors yea Waldroup yea. Carried.

The monthly reports of the City
Treasurer Police Magistrate and City Weigher was
read and upon motion referred to the Finance
Committee

The monthly report of the Superintendent
of Water Works was received read and upon motion
referred to the Water Committee.

The following communication was received from Henry Nichols

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I hereby waive statutory notice and publication requiring the building of sidewalk along the north end of Lots 13 and 14 in BK 108 in the City of Grand Junction.

Moved and seconded that the above notice be laid on the table. Carried

A communication was received from Leah F Ehrich asking the Council to postpone action against the removing of the building on lot 3 BK 117 of the City of Grand Junction, until the owner should return from the east.

Moved and seconded that the request be granted. Carried

The Chairman of the water committee reported that the plungers for the pump had arrived and that B W Bedder had resigned as pumpman resignation to take effect after the plungers were in place and the pump in good running condition. The report was accepted.

In the matter of extending the water mains from 6 street or Bedford to 7th st. and the placing of a fire hydrant. The Water Committee asked for more time in which to report.

Time was upon upon motion granted the above committee

The matter of ordering side walk on eighth street between Colo Ave & Wood st. was upon motion laid on the table.

The street & alley committee were upon motion ordered to have from 4 to 6 new stone crossings laid. Howden and Baker to have the laying of at least two crossings by the following vote Brumick voted yea Hards yea Warty yea M^{rs} Cary yea Shes yea Waldrop yea. Carried

The License Committee recommended that the license of J. E. Salmon be not transferred to the 11th block in Block 118.

The report of the License Committee was upon motion accepted.

Chas Jenkins was allowed to address the council upon the matter of a refund on water mains

moved and seconded that the matter of a refund to
Chas Jenkins be refered to the Water Committee carried

A communication was received from the
Jeansville Iron works stating that they could
furnish the City of Grand Junction with a pump
a duplicate of the present one with one or two small
changes for \$2620⁰⁰ It would take about six
months to deliver the same. The communication
was upon motion placed on file.

The Grand Valley Gas and Oil Co
notified the City of Grand Junction that they had
completed a well and had gas in sufficient quantity
to be of commercial value.

The report of the Grand Valley Gas and oil
company was accepted and placed on file.
